Dear Secretary Chu:

We are writing to thank you for adjusting DOE's rulemaking schedule for set top boxes to allow time for negotiations on a potential voluntary agreement among stakeholders. Over the past several months, the parties have met repeatedly and exchanged a range of proposals. We were not able to reach agreement by our self-imposed deadline of October 1, but extended discussions in an attempt to get an agreement. Unfortunately, despite intensive, good-faith efforts, the parties were not able to reach a consensus and the undersigned Advocates have now terminated negotiations.

Even though we were not successful in reaching a consensus agreement, DOE's pause in the regulatory process provided an opportunity for all stakeholders to become better informed about the opportunities and constraints with respect to set top box energy efficiency improvements. We thank you for providing us the opportunity to pursue a negotiated outcome. All of us will continue to be actively engaged in our own significant efforts to achieve greater energy efficiency in set-top boxes.
