Dear Mr. Megidish:

On April 22, 2011, the Office of the General Counsel of the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) served you, in your capacity as an officer of Turolight, Inc., with a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty ("Notice") issued pursuant to DOE's enforcement authority under the Energy Policy and Conservation Act of 1975, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 6291 et seq ("EPCA"). The Notice alleged that Turolight, Inc. manufactures a variety of incandescent reflector lamps, which it distributes in commerce in the United States of America and which are "covered products," as defined under EPCA. See 42 U.S.C. § 6291. The Notice further alleged that Turolight, Inc. failed to certify that each basic model meets the applicable energy conservation standard as required by 10 C.F.R. § 430.62, and that Turolight, Inc. failed to submit a certification and compliance statement for each basic model of these covered products as required by 10 C.F.R. § 430.62.

Following further discussions, DOE was able to confirm that Turolight, Inc. does not, in fact, manufacture or distribute these covered products in commerce in the United States, as was alleged. Therefore, the Notice is hereby withdrawn and the case is now closed.
