





The Holy Grail of Contract and Project Management

- In the ideal: contract management and project management staffing occurs at optimal levels, contracts and projects get executed in the most cost efficient manner and the mission gets maximum support.
- There is a world where there is:
 - Minimal risk of fraud
 - Minimal risk of waste

 - Minimal risk of mismanagement
 - Minimal extra costs to perform the task
 - Minimal delays in accomplishing the task

2006 2012 2008	 FAC-C announced January 2006 FAC-C first issued at DOE in 2012 FAC-C updated to reflect new curriculum at Level 2
May 7, 2014	 FAC-C Refresh issued. Curriculum requirements increased and strengthened. Education and experience requirements remain as before




