Proposed Action: Replace spacer dampers along the Schultz - Raver No. 3 & 4 500-kV transmission lines

Budget Information: Work Order #255064

<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.3, Routine maintenance activities...for structures, rights-of-way, infrastructures such as roads, equipment... routine maintenance activities, corrective....are required to maintain... infrastructures...in a condition suitable for a facility to be used for its designed purpose.

Proposed by: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA)

Location: BPA is proposing to replace 78 miles of spacers along the Schultz - Raver No. 3 & 4 500-kV transmission lines. The proposed project is located in King and Kittitas counties, Washington, and is within BPA's Covington and Wenatchee Operations and Maintenance Districts. Townships, Ranges & Sections for Schultz-Raver #3 & 4 Spacer Replacement Project

Description of the Proposed Action: BPA has a need to replace old and worn spacer-dampers on approximately 78 miles of the Schultz - Raver No. 3 & 4 500-kV transmission lines. Manned aerial carts that ride on the transmission line conductors would be used to change out the spacers. The carts would be placed on the transmission line by helicopter prior to line crews accessing the carts to perform the work. New spacers would be delivered by helicopter to the carts. Once the old spacers are changed, they would be picked up by ground vehicles and transported to a recycling center. The majority of the work would be performed above ground with minimal support from vehicles and crews on the ground. All vehicles would remain on existing access roads. All work would be conducted in accordance with National Electrical Safety Code and BPA standards. The work is necessary to provide system reliability.

Findings: BPA has determined that the proposed action complies with Section 1021.410 and Appendix B of Subpart D of the Department of Energy (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 Fed. Reg. 1512.2, April 24, 1992). The proposed action does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal. The proposal is not connected [40 C.F.R. 1508.25 (a)(1)] to other actions with potentially significant impacts, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impacts [40 C.F.R. 1508.25 (a)(2)], and is not precluded by 40 C.F.R. 1506.1 or 10 C.F.R. 1021.211. Moreover, the proposed action would not (i) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health; (ii) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities; (iii) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases; or (iv) adversely affect environmentally sensitive resources.

With the actions identified on the attachment, this proposed action meets the requirements for the Categorical Exclusion referenced above. We therefore determine that the proposed action may be categorically excluded from further NEPA review and documentation.
