**Proposed Action:** Provision of funds to Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks for purchase of the Perry Creek Property.

Fish and Wildlife Project No.: 2008-800-00, Contract 45235

## Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021):

**B1.25** Transfer, lease, disposition or acquisition of interests in uncontaminated land for habitat preservation or wildlife management, and only associated buildings that support these purposes. Uncontaminated means that there would be no potential for release of substances at a level, or in a form, that would pose a threat to public health or the environment.

Location: Township 24 North, Range 17 West, Section 31, Lake County, Montana

**Proposed by:** Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) and Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks (MFWP)

**Description of the Proposed Action:** BPA proposes to fund the acquisition of the 167 acre Perry Creek property by MFWP. BPA will be granted a perpetual conservation easement over the entire property as a condition of funding the acquisition. The property is being acquired as partial mitigation for the construction and operation of the Hungry Horse Dam on the South Fork of the Flathead River, and because of its outstanding riparian and floodplain natural resource values. Additionally, the property is important for providing habitat to bull trout, westslope cutthroat trout, grizzly bears, black bears, deer, elk, moose, waterfowl and other wildlife. The easement will protect the conservation values for which the property is being acquired by restricting activity such as residential, non-agricultural commercial and industrial development.

The property includes about 1 mile of riparian and wetland habitat along the Swan River and two tributaries--Perry Creek and Squaw Creek. Currently the area is used by wildlife and for public hunting and other forms of outdoor recreation.

After purchase of the property is complete, MFWP would manage the property to maintain habitat for fish and wildlife. MFWP would develop a management plan for the property and give the public the opportunity for involvement in developing the plan. There would also be an opportunity for the public to review and provide comments on the management plan prior to implementation of new actions on the property. Prior to the development of the management plan, public use would not change. Planned management activities on the property in the interim would be to manage invasive weeds. Spot and localized application would be done using only BPA approved herbicides. Current water rights would be changed from domestic use to fish and wildlife use after the acquisition.

**Findings:** BPA has determined that the proposed action complies with Section 1021.410 and Appendix B of Subpart D of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996). The proposed action does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal. The proposal is not connected [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(1)] to other actions with potentially significant impacts, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impacts [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(2)], and is not precluded by 40 C.F.R. 1506.1 or 10 C.F.R. 1021.211. Moreover, the proposed action would not (i) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, (ii) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities, (iii) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases, or (iv) adversely affect environmentally sensitive resources.

This proposed action meets the requirements for the Categorical Exclusion referenced above. We therefore determine that the proposed action may be categorically excluded from further NEPA review and documentation.
