HUB Zone Program-Definition

- HUB Zone=Historically Underutilized Business Zone
- HUB Zone area general qualifiers:
 - low median household incomes
 - high unemployment
 - high poverty

HUB Zone Program-Purpose

Affords federal contracting opportunities to qualified small firms in designated HUB Zones to:

- **Increase employment opportunities**
- Stimulate capital investment
- **Empower communities through economic leveraging**

HUB Zone Program-Benefits

Set-aside awards

Sole source awards

10% price evaluation preference (full and open competition)

HUB Zone Program-Qualifying Areas

- A Qualified Nonmetropolitan County*
- A Qualified Census Tract*
- An Indian Land
- A Qualified Base Closure Area (BRAC)

*When a county or tract loses HUB Zone qualification, the area is redesignated for three years.



HUB Zone Program-Business Eligibility

- Small business by SBA standards
- At least 51% directly and unconditionally owned and controlled by:
 - U.S. citizen
 - Community Development Corporation*
 - agricultural cooperative*
 - Indian tribe*

*See 13 CFR 126 for additional requirements

HUB Zone Program-Business Eligibility

Principal office must be located within a designated HUB Zone

At least 35% of company's employees must reside in a HUB Zone



HUB Zone Program-Contracting Goals

- Federal Government-Wide Goals: Prime Contracting & Subcontracting
- HUB Zone Goals: 3% of total contracting dollars
- HUB Zone goal attainment government-wide=still a challenge

HUB Zone Program-Maintaining Certification

- Material changes affecting HUB Zone status
- HUB Zone recertification every 3 years
- Incorporate HUB Zone certification maintenance into business plan
- Designate a company HUB Zone point of contact/expert
