






Working with Multiple Partners to Enhance Site Infrastructure



Community Reuse Organization of East Tennessee (CROET) is Developing Site as a Blended, Multi-Use Industrial Park




The Transfer Process Takes at Least 16 Months

K-31/K-33 Large Parcel Transfer is Imminent!!


