

- It takes individuals such as yourselves to stay engaged and help the Department make complex and important decisions
- Your clean up decision-making support can involve a number of different decision processes. They often rely on seeing "the big picture" and understanding its context, importance and implications



## A menu of opportunities for input

- National Environmental Policy Act groundbreaking cornerstone of public involvement
- Comprehensive Environmental Compensation and Liability
   Act significant public involvement efforts from its outset
- Resource Conservation and Recovery Act a prescriptive process often combined with other efforts
- Permitting: Clean Water Act/National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System, Discharge of Dredge or Fill Materials, Clean Air Act/Prevention of Significant Deterioration, etc.
- Other consultative processes: Endangered Species Act, National Historic Preservation Act

### What does that mean... "Substantive vs. Administrative?"

Substantive pertains to the action or conditions in the environment e.g. quantitative health or risk-based standards, liners in landfills, MCLs in drinking water

Administrative = regulations that facilitate the substantive requirements, e.g., permits, approvals, or consent with administrative bodies, and documentation, reporting and recordkeeping

#### "Other Laws" under CERCLA like...

- Clean Air Act
- Clean Water Act
- Resource Conservation Recovery Act
- National Historic Preservation Act
- Endangered Species Act

# You can see the effects of ARARs throughout the process

- From the RI/FS to the Proposed Plan to the Record of Decision...
- ARARs provide the logic tie to alternative development and ultimately to remedy selection
- The means of ARARs compliance helps design the solution

#### **Decisions. Decisions**

#### 9 criteria for CERCLA decisions

Threshold - Must be protective

- Must be ARARs compliant

Balancing - Long-term effectiveness

- Short-term effectiveness
- Cost
- Reduce toxicity, mobility & volume
- Implementability

Modifying - State Acceptance

- Community Acceptance

## The value of ARARs to the clean-up process

- \*ARARs distill the issues and focus them
- ARARs provide objectivity
- \*ARARs avoid the funnel effect
  - they foster and forge new working relationships
  - have a broader level of public involvement
- Have an "as practicable" provision
- There is a schedule that keeps you moving forward and working together









- Your support is invaluable
- There are many types of decision processes and public involvement is a part of all of them
- There are many success stories and more are in the works
- The CERCLA ARARs process helps DOE attain informed decisions sooner, getting to clean-up sooner, getting to your site's future sooner
