Dear Interested Party,

This email is being provided to individuals that have previously indicated an interest in the Clean Line Plains & Eastern Application under Section 1222 of the *Energy Policy Act of 2005*. Today, the Department of Energy issued a notice in the *Federal Register* (<https://www.federalregister.gov/articles/2015/04/28/2015-09941/application-for-proposed-project-for-clean-line-plains-and-eastern-transmission-line>) that requests public comment on Clean Line's updated application. The project addressed in the application would include an overhead  $\pm$  600-kilovolt (kV) high voltage, direct current electric transmission system and associated facilities with the capacity to deliver approximately 3,500 megawatts primarily from renewable energy generation facilities in the Oklahoma and Texas Panhandle regions to load-serving entities in the Mid-South and Southeast United States via an interconnection with the Tennessee Valley Authority electrical grid.

The public review of Clean Line's application is a separate process from that conducted under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). The NEPA public comment period on the Draft Environmental Impact Statement ended on April 20, 2015. Comments previously submitted during the NEPA process related to Section 1222 will also be addressed under this application review process and do not need to be resubmitted.

Comments on the updated application must be submitted on or before June 12, 2015.
