## U.S. Department of Energy Office of Legacy Management National Environmental Policy Act Environmental Checklist

Project/Activity: Reclamation Projects on Slick Rock Lease Tract C-SR-11, Uranium Leasing Program

### A. Brief Project/Activity Description

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Office of Legacy Management (LM) proposes various reclamation activities related to abandoned mines and mine features that constitute a public safety concern. Independent contractors associated with the lessee (Cotter Corporation) and under supervision of uranium leasing program (ULP) personnel would complete the work, and all projects would be completed within approximately 3 weeks. C-SR-11 is located in southwestern San Miguel County, Colorado. The total estimated surface disturbance would cover 3 acres.

Numerous pits and trenches located on the Beth Claim remain open and are a public safety hazard. Suitable fill material (mine-waste rock) is present around some of the pit perimeters. To reclaim these disturbed areas, the side walls of the trenches would be reduced, and mine-waste materials would be used to fill the depressions. Nearby soil materials (from a source identified by ULP personnel) also would be used as fill in the depressions. After final grading is completed, the reclaimed area would appear similar to the surrounding undulating topography. An approved seed mixture would be used to restore a vegetative cover.

Mine-waste rock from the Tomboy Mine site has washed onto the roadway as a result of a heavy storm event. This material would be cleaned off the road, and the road would be re-graded to allow access.

A subsidence at the previously backfilled Mercantile No. 3 Mine portal needs to be permanently closed. The subsidence must be dug out enough to allow large rocks to be placed in the opening and then be pushed back to the point of refusal. The opening would be backfilled with additional mine-waste rock and covered with common borrow surface materials from a source identified by ULP personnel and reseeded with an approved seed mixture.

Due to the highly disturbed nature of the area, no cultural resources are present nor is habitat for protected species present. All activities would be conducted after the migratory bird and nesting season were over in 2010.

The reclamation of the areas are allowable activities under Criterion B1.3, Routine Maintenance.
