Proposed Action: Access road improvement for the Kalispell-Kerr #1, 115-kilovolt (kV)

transmission line

PP&A Project No.: 2474

<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.3 Routine Maintenance, B1.13 Pathways, short access roads, and rail lines

Location: Township 26 North, Range 21 West, Section 13 and 24, Flathead County, MT.

Proposed by: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA)

Description of the Proposed Action: BPA proposes to perform access road maintenance on several segments of the access road for the Kalispell-Kerr #1, 115-kV transmission line. Work includes reconstruction and drainage enhancements on 5000 feet of road beginning at structure 15/6 and ending at structure 16/7. Activities include the following:

- Raising the existing road grade 4 feet for 500 feet using 1067 cubic yards (cu yds) of pit run starting at 15/6+445 feet to 15/7+120 feet.
- Raising the existing grade 1 foot for 500 feet using 267 cu yds of pit run starting at 15/7 +120 feet to 15/7+620 feet.
- Placing 155 cu yds of 1½ inch crushed aggregate surfacing on 1000 feet of road for a finished height of 4 inches.
- Placing 60 cu yds of 4 inch or bigger rock to armor 350 feet of drainage slope.
- Installing 450 feet of silt fencing.

No in-stream work will be performed. Road work will be confined to the existing road prism. Improvements are needed to improve water drainage and reduce flooding of road segments from adjacent creeks. Silt fencing will be installed prior to road work for erosion control and protection of nearby water resources.

The proposed action will allow safe and timely access to the transmission line, which will help reduce outage times and maintain reliable power in the region. All work will be in accordance with the National Electrical Safety Code and BPA standards.

<u>Findings</u>: BPA has determined that the proposed action complies with Section 1021.410 and Appendix B of Subpart D of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy

Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011). The proposed action does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal. The proposal is not connected [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(1)] to other actions with potentially significant impacts, has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impacts [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(2)], and is not precluded by 40 C.F.R. 1506.1 or 10 C.F.R. 1021.211. Moreover, the proposed action would not (i) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, (ii) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities, (iii) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases, (iv) have the potential to cause significant impacts on environmentally sensitive resources, or (v) involve genetically engineered organisms, synthetic biology, governmentally designated noxious weeds, or invasive species, unless the proposed activity would be contained or confined in a manner designed and operated to prevent unauthorized release into the environment and conducted in accordance with applicable requirements.

This proposed action meets the requirements for the Categorical Exclusion referenced above. We therefore determine that the proposed action may be categorically excluded from further NEPA review and documentation.
