At the request of the Organization for International Investment (OFII), staff from the Office of Policy and International Affairs (PI) and the Advanced Research Project Agency- Energy (ARPA-E) of the Department of Energy (DOE) met on Tuesday, September 8th. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the eligibility of U.S. subsidiaries and affiliates of foreign-registered companies to participate in ARPA-E funding opportunities. OFII provided background on their organization and introduced a Dartmouth University study by Professor Matthew Slaughter. No specific client or pending application was discussed in regards to Recovery Act funding.
