The American Recovery & Reinvestment Act (ARRA) is making a meaningful down payment on the nation's energy and environmental future. The Recovery Act investments in Puerto Rico are supporting a broad range of clean energy projects, from solar power to wind. Through these investments, Puerto Rico's universities, non-profits, and local governments are creating quality jobs today and positioning Puerto Rico to play an important role in the new energy economy of the future.

The Executive Office of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico has received \$37.1 million in State Energy Program funds to enhance existing funding for territory-level energy efficiency program grants.

\$48.9

The Executive Office of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico has received \$48.9 million in Weatherization Assistance Program funds to scale-up existing weatherization efforts on the island, creating jobs, reducing carbon emissions, and manage local energy saving money for Puerto Rico's low-income families. Over the course of the Recovery Act, Puerto Rico expects to weatherize approximately 5,500 homes.

Forty-two communities in Puerto Rico received a total of \$34 million for Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grants (EECBG) to develop, promote, implement, and efficiency programs.

The Executive Office of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico has received \$3.8 million for the Energy Efficient Appliance Rebate Program, which offers consumer rebates for purchasing certain ENERGY STAR® appliances. These energy efficient appliances reduce energy use and save money for families, while helping the environment and supporting the local economy.

#### **EXAMPLES OF PUERTO RICO COMPETITIVE GRANTS AND TAX CREDITS**

Award

\$0.7 million

**PV Properties Inc.** has received three 1603 payments for renewable energy generation totaling \$703,000. The funds will be used to install solar power systems.

\$0.6 million

The Executive Office of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico in San Juan was awarded \$563,000 to enhance inter- and intra-state and territory coordination and cooperation during energy emergencies.
