

Oversight

- Oversight is provided by Departmental offices, other Federal and State agencies, Defense Nuclear Facility Safety Board, other governmental entities that are autonomous to the EMRAP
- These entities make independent, informed judgments of performance and compliance
- Project oversight provides insight on:
 - Poor administration;
 - Waste, fraud and abuse;
 - Potential arbitrary and capricious behaviors or decisions;
 - Actions, products or systems that may be out of compliance or illegal;
 - Conditions or situations that may compromise the safety or security of nuclear materials; and
 - Worker behaviors, site conditions, or facility configurations that potentially compromise worker, public, or environmental safety.

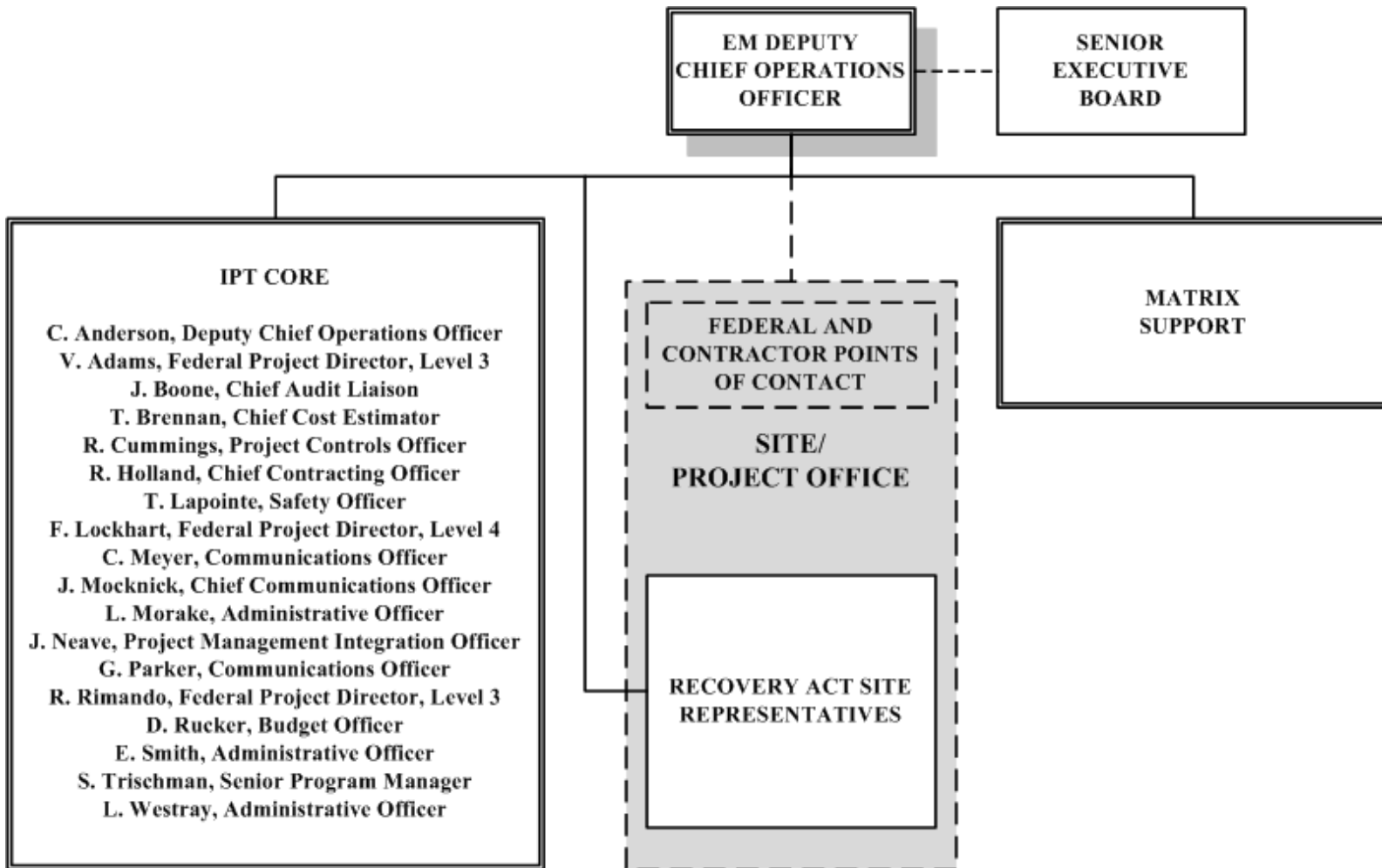

- Provide continuous improvement by providing real-time information on best practices, lessons learned and emerging issues



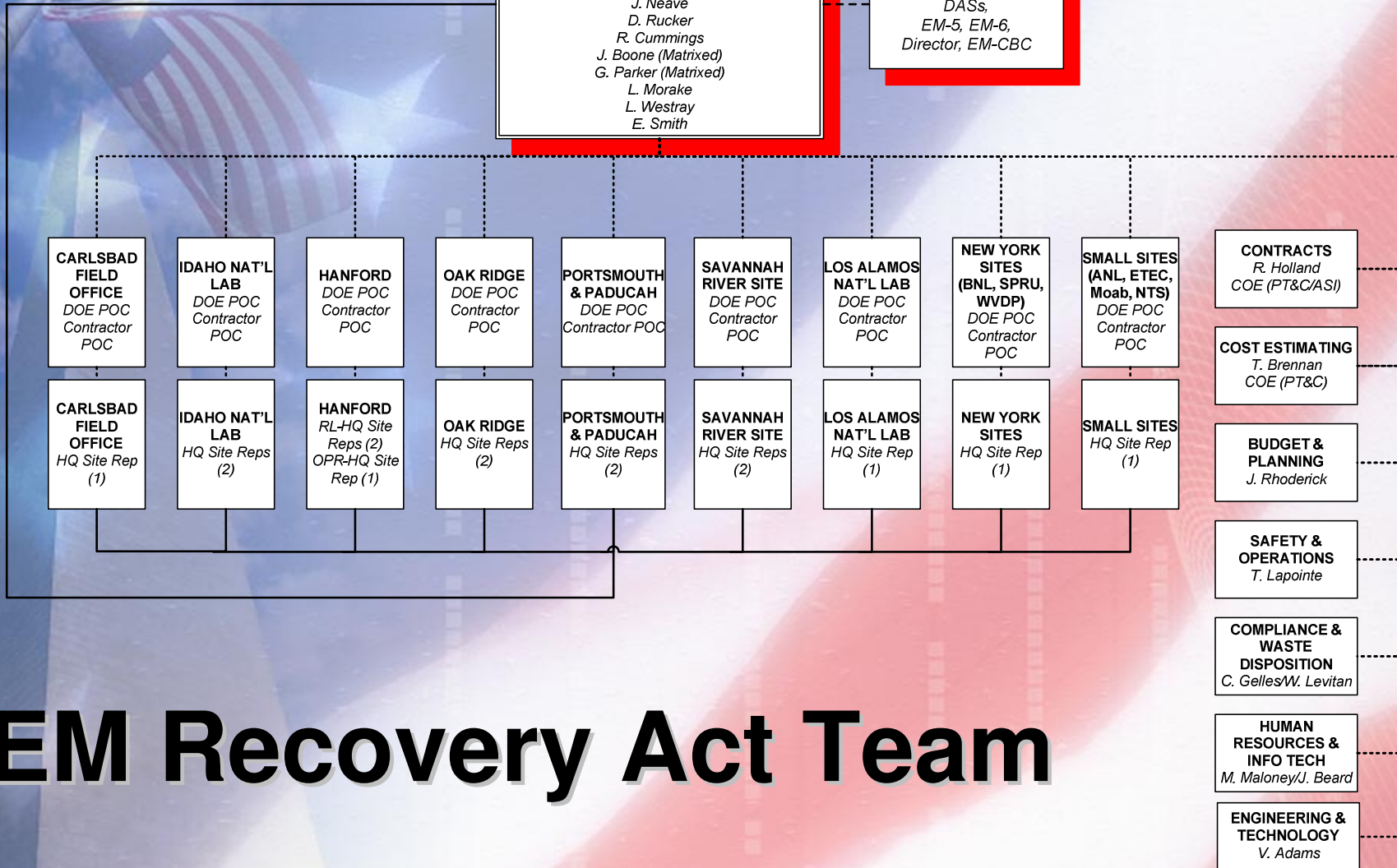
