January Certification Review Board:

The first Certification Review Board (CRB or Board) meeting for calendar year 2010 will be held on January 22.



Certification Equivalency Guidelines (CEG) Update on the Employee Self Service (ESS) System:

The PMCDP has revised several competency requirements for all of the four levels of PMCDP certification. These changes became effective on January 1, 2010, and the Corporate Human Resources Information System (CHRIS)/ESS PMCDP module has been updated.

All certification packages submitted by the program and field offices prior to December 31, 2009, will be reviewed based on the

old PMCDP requirements; all packages received after that date will be reviewed based on the new requirements. The PMCDP changes include new course requirements as courses have been developed and added to the PMCDP curriculum. Experiential requirements for detailing a candidate's respective knowledge and expertise have also been added. These competency requirements were first identified in the March 2009 CEG document.

The following is a brief summary of some of the more notable competency course changes for each level of PMCDP certification.

Level 1 requirements:

- Candidates will be required to demonstrate workinglevel knowledge of the Test and Evaluation process under competency 1.3.2
- Candidates will be required to demonstrate workinglevel knowledge of the DOE Acquisition System under competency 1.9.4
- Candidates will now be required to select one elective option
- Acquisition Management for

Technical Personnel has been added as a core course

Level 2 requirements:

 Candidates will be required to select two electives as opposed to one

For Level 3 requirements, candidates will be required to demonstrate expert-level knowledge of:

- DOE O 413.3A and Guides under competency 3.1.2
- Leadership/Team Building under competency 3.2.1
- Scope Management under competency 3.3.1
- Communication Management under competency 3.4.1

- Quality/Safety Management under competency 3.5.1
- Cost Management under competency 3.6.1
- Time Management under competency 3.7.1
- Practices in Advanced Risk Management under competency 3.8.1
- Contract Management under competency 3.9.1
- Integration Management under competency 3.10.1
- A new core course, Advanced Risk Management, was added.

Level 4 was only affected by curriculum changes.

Corrective Action Plan (CAP) Corner: Contract and Project Management CAP Update and Way Ahead

The Deputy Secretary set an aggressive Departmental goal to get off the Government Accountability Office's (GAO) High Risk List by January 2011, so we have some tough work ahead of us this fiscal year.

The Department has made a steadfast commitment to making tangible improvements in contract and project management performance, and it permeates the Department from headquarters to the field offices. We are improving Departmental front-end planning efforts by publishing the Technology Readiness Assessment Guide and instituting a **Project Definition Rating** Index tool.

Further, a Staffing Guide was developed to facilitate federal project staffing (including contracted support staff) based on analysis of past and current Departmental project data. This Guide is still in RevCom.

Also, we have promulgated a full-funding policy to improve budget profiles and project cost baselines.

Finally, the Office of Cost Analysis (OCA) was established to provide independent cost estimates and reviews for programs/ projects at various critical decision steps and lead the development of Department-wide cost databases and cost estimating directives. So, what is left undone in our Corrective Action Plan? We will launch the next generation of the Project Assessment and Reporting System (PARS-II) and export the Office of Science cross-functional project peer review process, which will greatly improve project oversight and management. Additionally, we are making critical updates to Departmental program/project management and acquisition directives. We are establishing uniform methods for assessing risks to

ensure risks associated with projects are objectively identified, assessed, communicated and managed through all phases of planning and execution. Collectively, these investments will strengthen contract and project performance.

However, the overall success of these investments will be realized only if we fully support and truly implement these corrective measures. The measures will be monitored and tracked against clearlydefined metrics to ensure success. These metrics are reported annually to the Deputy Secretary, GAO and the Office of Management and Budget, revealing our contract and project management performance trends. The Deputy Secretary recognizes this is an aggressive goal, but with our personal commitment, he is confident it can be achieved.

Question of the Month

Question: I submitted a certification package for CRB consideration in mid-December, and I am not slated for CRB action until February 2010. Will I be responsible for the new PMCDP requirements that became effective January 1, 2010?

Answer: If your package is approved by your Program Secretarial Officer and was forwarded to OECM prior to January 1, 2010, your profile will be reviewed, based on the March 2009 version of the CEG. If the package is submitted to OECM after January 1, 2010, you will be required to follow the new standards.
