Federal Project Director (FPD) Corner: Important Information

Regarding PMCDP Continuing Education Requirements

All Federal Project Directors (FPDs) certified under the PMCDP are required to complete 80 continuing education (CE) credits on a biennial basis to maintain a PMCDP certification. This helps to ensure DOE's project management community stays abreast of advancements in technology and project management.

The PMCDP recognizes – and provides – many options to fulfill CE requirements; however, participants should be aware that all claimed CE credits must be for activities geared toward "continuous learning", not activities classified as "required training" specific to a particular job role or

position. For example, certain miscellaneous training activities, such as security refreshers or ethics training courses, do not meet CE requirements. For credit to be granted, all training must be "above and beyond" the scope of an employee's jobrelated requirements. Additionally, all classroom-based and on-line training courses must:

- be no fewer than seven hours of training per day;
- be a graded course, with attendance requirements, relevant to the management of highly technical projects; and

issue a completion certificate.

When submitting CE hour requests, you or your supporting program will need to provide information to justify CE activities that include a copy of the completion certificate, course description and the course duration. For a complete listing of the different training options permitted under the PMCDP, please reference the Continuing Education Credit Assignment Table (see Section 7 of the Certification and **Equivalency Guidelines** [CEG]). Question of the Month

Question: According to the PMCDP's Continuing Education Credit Assignment Table, incumbent FPDs earn 10 CE hours of credit over a two-year period. I have been a Level III FPD for nearly two years, and my biennial CE requirement is

due in the next few weeks. Will I be eligible for the 10 CEUs?

Answer: It depends. The formal definition of "incumbent FPDs" are those formally appointed to direct capital assets in accordance with DOE O 413.3B, *Program*

and Project Management for the Acquisition of Capital Assets. Thus, if you have been assigned to manage a DOE capital asset project during this two-year period, you will earn 10 CEUs. If not, this option will not be available to you. PAGE 2 NOVEMBER 2010

Corrective Action Plan (CAP) Corner: Activities Coming to Closure

The Department of Energy (DOE) made a commitment over the past several years to make tangible improvements in contract and project management performance. More importantly, improving DOE contract and project management continues to be a top priority of the Department's senior management and entire organization.

The Department has achieved several accomplishments through the Root Cause Analysis, Corrective Action Plan implementation, namely:

- continued senior DOE management commitment and leadership to improve contract and project management, including project management policy memoranda from the Deputy Secretary of Energy;
- conducted over 25 Deputy Secretary-led 'deep dives' on capital asset projects, programs and contracts;
- improved its Project Assessment and Reporting System to keep leadership aware of project status and to effect appropriate corrective actions in a timely manner;
- strengthened project management procedures by revising
 DOE Order 413.3A, Program and
 Project Management for the Acquisition of Capital Assets, along
 with revisions to, or development of, associated supporting
 Guides, including risk management and change control;

- improved the staffing and associated competencies of Project Management Support Offices within the Offices of Environmental Management, Science and the National Nuclear Security Administration;
- enhanced the Project Management and Acquisition Career
 Development Programs to improve the training and qualifications of contract and project management personnel;
- achieved many Project Management Professional and Certified Cost Engineer certifications with more in the pipeline;
- expanded the breadth and depth in the scope of External Independent Reviews, expanding lines of inquiry; and
- enhanced the use of project management tools and techniques, including Technology Readiness Assessments, Project Definition Rating Index, Risk Registers and Monte Carlo risk analyses, and earned value measurement, for improved management decision-making.

Despite these accomplishments, the Department recognizes that further improvements are necessary to continue demonstrating improved contract and project management performance. Accordingly, DOE is conducting a Contract and Project Management Summit in December 2010 to keep management attention focused on the select challenges that require further improvement. These chal-

lenges include, but are not limited to:

- project and contract alignment and change control;
- contract administration, including surveillance, monitoring and oversight;
- program/project prioritization and funding alignment;
- roles and responsibilities contracting officers and contracting officer representatives;
- accountability aligning incentives; and
- adequate project and contract management staffing.

Continuous improvements in each of these areas will be implemented directly by the Department's Program and Staff/Support Offices. DOE understands the principles fundamental to effective project management, including leadership commitment, appropriate management and technical expertise and disciplined and rigorous implementation of project management policies. These principles have been, and will continue to be, aggressively pursued by the Department to ensure project management requirements are consistently followed, oversight of contractors continues to improve, and accountability for performance is strengthened. Ultimately, the Department's effectiveness and success will be measured by the continued improvement of cost and schedule performance.


