The Ombudsman office also takes an enterprise-wide view by helping to identify trends, issues and systemic concerns impacting the entire Department. With employees, managers, and senior leaders playing an active role in working through challenges in a healthy and productive way, we will be ready and able to stay laser focused on the mission.
