Fernald Ecology Programs

Luke Thies is an interpretive specialist at Fernald Preserve. He is a U.S. Geological Society sub-permittee Bird Bander, doing surveys and mist nets at potential banding locations for research projects such as "Monitoring Avian Productivity and Survivorship." Additionally, he is a board member of the National Audubon Society Cincinnati Chapter.



- **Waterfowl Walk**

Saturday, Feb. 7, 8-9 a.m.

Join our Interpretive Specialist Luke Thies on a walk to look for some waterfowl around the preserve. From Ducks and Geese to Swans and Coots, we can usually find all sorts of great birds in the former production area. This hike will cover unpaved and sometimes uneven terrain, so sturdy footwear is a must for participants.

- **Birds of the Preserve Walk**

Fernald Preserve covers over 1,000 acres of restored habitat, and 260 species of birds have been documented on-site. Interpretive Specialist Luke Thies will guide our group on an general exploration of the preserve and its trails, with a special focus on finding winter migrants and any notable recent sightings.

Introduction to Bird Identification

Learn how to identify residential and migratory bird species that occur throughout Cincinnati based on their size and shape, color and pattern, behavior, habitat, and songs and calls. We'll also learn about essential tools such as binoculars, field guides, and various other resources as well as tips for beginner birdwatchers. Extra binoculars will be available to borrow.

Ash Conway is an educator, avid birdwatcher, and community organizer. They are the founder of the UC Ornithology Club as well as the founder and director of Queer Birders of Cincinnati. Ash is a former naturalist for the Great Parks of Hamilton County and a bird banding assistant with the University of Cincinnati.



Birds of the Oxbow

- **Birds of the Oxbow with Jon Seymour**

In the central Ohio Valley, the most important remaining wetland is a 3,000-acre spread of level river bottom farmland at the confluence of the Great Miami and Ohio Rivers, known as the Oxbow. The Oxbow lies in the midsection of the Ohio Valley and is a vital staging area for migrating birds and summer and winter residents. There have been 293 species of birds documented at the site. Join Oxbow Inc. Board President Jon Seymour as he shares the story of this remarkable site, the birds that rely on it, and the ongoing efforts to preserve it.

Everyone's favorite wintertime visitor should be back and prowling the prairies of Fernald at sunset. Come join us on a 1-mile walk in the former production area as we look for the Short-eared Owls. We recommend wearing sturdy shoes for this, as the trails are unpaved and sometimes uneven.

Hop in your vehicle and join us on a car ride to spot some Short-eared Owls. This program is targeted toward audience members with mobility issues who might not be able to attend our normal owl programs. Space is limited, so please be respectful of this. Join us on a sunset walk up the On-Site Disposal Facility. This walk will put you up high for a birds-eye view of the Short-eared Owls that usually fly around the prairie. This walk can be challenging, as the grade of the walk up is quite steep, so participants should wear sturdy footwear and bring a flashlight for the walk back down. Participants are required to stay with Fernald staff for the duration of the hike.

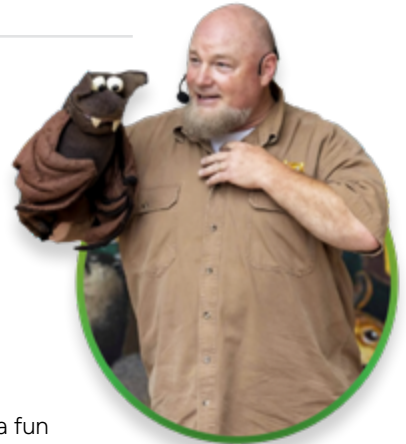

The Sparrows of Fernald

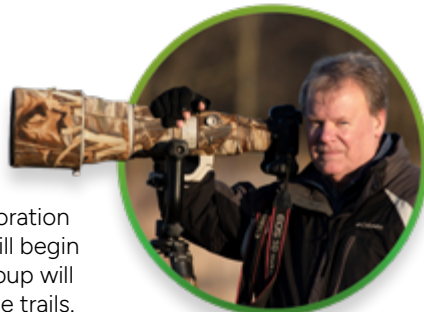
- **The Sparrows of Fernald Presentation and Walk with Jim McCormac**

- **All About Owls Live Raptors Program with RAPTOR Inc.**

While most of our migrants work to fly north to breed, did you know that owls are already ahead of the flock? These lifelong amorous avians are already incubating eggs and will have to rely on their specialized adaptations to care for their mates and the newly hatched owlets. Join two educators from RAPTOR Inc. along with their education ambassadors to learn how owls survive in the wild, discover how you can help them in your everyday life, and get an up-close experience with our favorite nocturnal hunters.

RAPTOR Inc. is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to the conservation of birds of prey via rehabilitation, education, field research, and community service. They rehabilitate approximately 400 birds of prey annually and deliver over 350 educational presentations each year at schools, libraries, senior centers, and other community events.



Love in the Garden

Love is in the air... Even now, in midwinter, numerous birds have begun their courtship rituals. Is there truly something in the air? Is it the light cycle? Or has Cupid's arrow affected all wildlife, causing some unusual behavior as we move into breeding season? Join local Naturalist Carol Mundy for this lighthearted look at birds and other wildlife as they seem to be "in the mood" for love...

While she holds a degree in Animal Health from the University of Cincinnati, Carol Mundy has been a nature enthusiast her whole life and claims she came by most of her natural history knowledge through osmosis. Carol was a naturalist with the Hamilton County Park District in Cincinnati for nearly 30 years and hosts a weekly radio program on WMKV in Cincinnati about the interesting and sometimes unusual aspects of nature, science, and culture.



The Love Lives of Birds

- **The Love Lives of Birds Virtual Presentation with Laura Erickson**

Valentine's Day is a perfect time to focus on the courting and mating habits of birds, from the handful of species that enter a permanent, inviolable pair bond as long as both birds remain alive to those whose "bond" lasts mere seconds or minutes. Whether a mated pair looks identical or appears to belong to two different species; whether the pair shares all the responsibilities of building a nest and raising young or follows rigid sex roles; whether a permanently bonded pair sticks together year round or takes separate vacations — the possibilities are endless.

Laura Erickson, author of *The Love Lives of Birds*, will take us on a romantic rendezvous with several of our favorite backyard birds, sharing their secret and not-so-secretive ways. Laura, who started her life list 50 years ago and immediately began keeping track of courtship, mating, and nesting, is the award-winning author of a dozen books about birds, a former licensed bird rehabilitator, and a past science editor at the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. Her "For the Birds" (available as a podcast) is the longest-running radio program about birds in America.

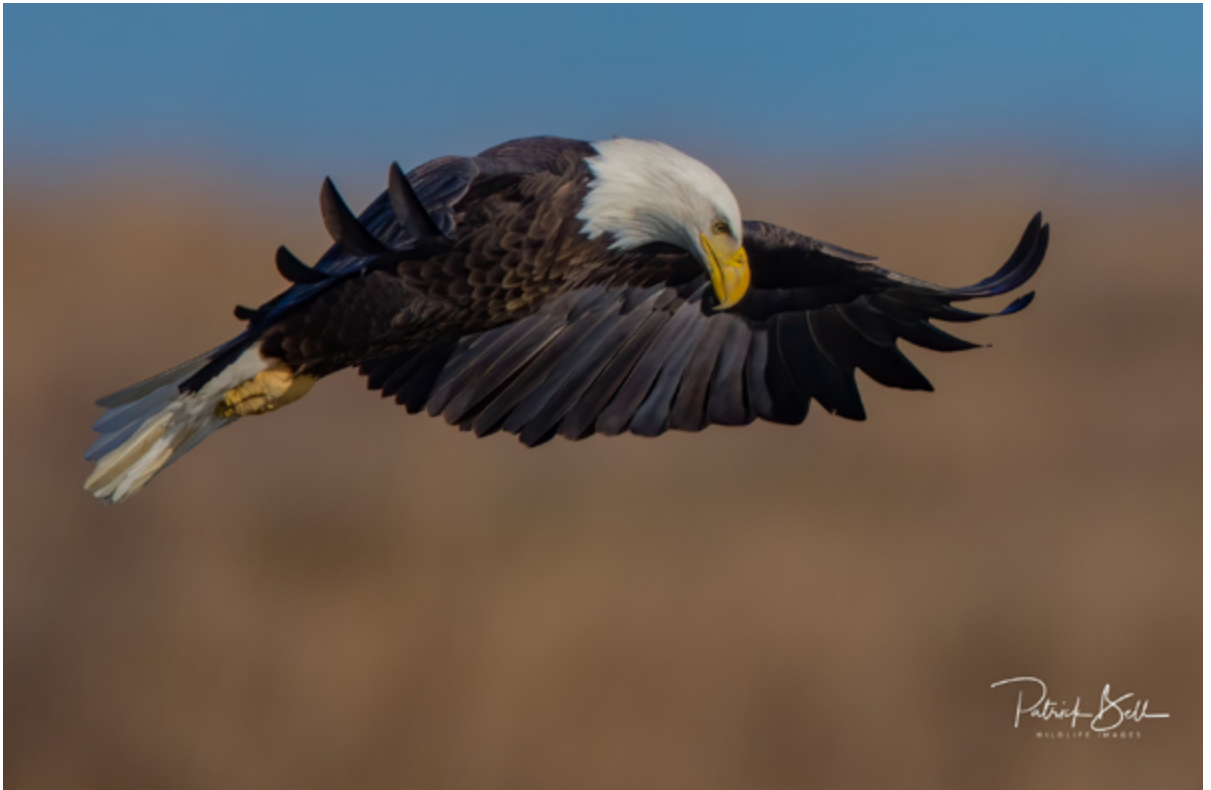

From downtown Cincinnati

- ✓ North on I-75 to west on I-74 (toward Indianapolis) to Exit 7, State Route 128 (Hamilton-Cleves Highway).
- ✓ North (right) on State Route 128 through Miamitown for 7 miles to Willey Road.
- ✓ Left on Willey Road, ¼ mile to the Fernald Preserve entrance on the right.

From Dayton and northern Ohio

- ✓ South on I-75 (toward Cincinnati) to west on I-275 to Exit 33A, U.S. 27 (Colerain Avenue).
- ✓ North (right) on U.S. 27 for 5 miles to the Hamilton-Ross exit.
- ✓ Left on State Route 128 (Hamilton-Cleves Highway) through Ross for 4 miles to Willey Road.
- ✓ Right on Willey Road, ¼ mile to the Fernald Preserve entrance on the left.



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
