The Office of Nuclear Energy (NE) intends to fill a vacancy using direct hire authority. This position is located in the Office of Facilities Management (NE-31), Office of Nuclear Infrastructure Programs, Office of Nuclear Energy.

The NE-31 Director manages the design, construction, and operation of NE nuclear and non-nuclear facilities, research reactors, and infrastructure consistent with DOE policies and practices with emphasis on safe, environmentally acceptable, and efficient operations. The Director implements and develops policies and strategies that ensure safe and effective operation of NE facilities to support NE program requirements and the needs of other users of NE facilities.

The position requires a high level of expertise in the areas of real property and nuclear research infrastructure portfolio management. The position also requires extensive knowledge of scientific and technical matters related to NE and DOE to resolve policy and operational issues that have technical and financial implications, and to interface externally with senior level DOE and Administration officials and Congressional representatives.

The position also requires business and financial expertise, including the ability to formulate and defend program budgets and related resource requests for Secretarial, Office of Management and Budget, and Congressional reviews as well as development and annual execution of infrastructure investment plans in accordance with approved allocations.

A year of supervisory experience and strong communication skills with senior government, commercial industry, and contractor officials preferred.
