#### Goals:

 Help low-income households reduce their energy burden and save money by analyzing utility data and leveraging available services and resources

- Support utilities in their efforts to more effectively design and manage energy efficiency programs to better serve their customers
- Help communities and residents benefit from energy efficiency and assistance programs offered by community service providers, utilities, nonprofits, and local governments
- Develop metrics to determine energy burden levels of individual households to help reduce energy usage and improve energy assistance program services

Method: Create a mapping database of energy efficiency and assistance programs; merge energy use information from participating utilities with publicly-available information on poverty, income, household attributes and housing stock.




Figure 1 Income Map Screenshot from PEEIF Storybook
