Georgetown University Energy Prize (GUEP) participants Michael Walton of green|spaces and Gina Matthias of Takoma Park, MD, will amplify their communities' energy efficiency innovations in the session, "The Amazing Race for \$Millions: The Georgetown University Energy Prize," on March 22 at 10:30 a.m. The winner of GUEP, a \$5 million energy efficiency competition among 50 communities, will be named shortly, once the judges review the participants' latest achievements.

accomplishments, through the Reporting and Recognition Template. Submitting this information to DOE is the only requirement of Residential Network membership.

Thanks and congratulations to Residential Network member Michigan Saves for reporting the following in fiscal year 2015: 1,273 energy upgrades; lifetime energy savings of 15,588,327 kilowatt hours, 3,819,235 therms, and 435,072 million British thermal units; and \$13,341,868 financed in residential loans.
