DOE Toolkit Launch: A New Approach to Evaluate as You

Home energy assessors who engage with homeowners, discuss more than just money, and help homeowners through the process appear to have a higher rate of conversion to energy upgrades. Better Buildings Residential Network Member the American Council for an Energy-Efficient Economy (ACEEE) conducted an

online behavioral science experiment engaging nearly 2,000 American homeowners to determine what messaging used during home energy assessments led to more energy-efficient upgrades. Evaluating the results of the experiment and the latest research, ACEEE found that financial motivators are only part of the equation.

"How to Talk about Home Energy Upgrades" includes practical recommendations for framing home energy upgrade messages that can be used by assessors and programs in general. ACEEE has also created a one-page resource, How to Talk about Home Energy Upgrades: A tip sheet for energy auditors.

CLEAResult Sets the Pace for Upgrades

Each spring, the Better Buildings Residential Network asks members to report the number of annual upgrades they completed, as well as any associated benefits or other accomplishments, through



the <u>Reporting and Recognition Template</u>. Submitting this information to DOE is the only requirement of Residential Network membership.

The results are clear for Residential Network member <u>CLEAResult</u>. The organization reported performing 156,000 energy upgrades in fiscal year 2016, saving residential customers a total of 29.1 million therms of natural gas and 1.8 billion kilowatt-hours of electricity.
