Network Members Spring Into Action in Home Upgrade Program Accelerator

Three Residential Network members that have partnered with DOE?s Better Buildings Home Upgrade Program Accelerator are ahead of their program goals. Both the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) and Build It Green (Oakland, CA) have streamlined home energy program data processing by adopting HPXML, a national residential energy efficiency data standard. This improvement decreases transactional costs associated with collecting and transferring energy efficiency program data between contractors and the program and gives contractors a choice in selecting a qualified energy modeling software.

NeighborWorks of Western Vermont (NWWVT), a nonprofit organization helping residents make energy efficiency upgrades through its HEAT Squad program, worked with the Vermont state energy efficiency utility and fellow Residential Network member Efficiency Vermont to achieve software integration across their two programs. This improvement has reduced HEAT Squad's processing time for submitting completed energy assessments to Efficiency Vermont from 40 down to 5 minutes and has allowed NWWVT to reallocate resources elsewhere in the program.
