

# Addressing Excess Contaminated Facilities on the Oak Ridge Reservation


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### Congress and the EM Program are committed to meaningful risk reduction across the DOE complex



- Government Accountability Office and Inspector General audits identified numerous high risk excess facilities in deteriorating conditions across the DOE complex
- A working group was established to examine and prioritize excess facilities to address risks
- The Administration and Congress responded by requesting and appropriating funds to begin addressing these risks in Fiscal Year 2016







### Excess contaminated facilities are a significant liability for Oak Ridge







- 200+ excess buildings
- Oak Ridge contains 64 of DOE's 182 high-risk facilities
- Wide range of physical, chemical, and nuclear hazards that present risk to critical ongoing research and national security missions

### The Oak Ridge EM program has appropriated funding available to address risks at Y-12 and ORNL



- OREM has received nearly \$225 million through Fiscal Year 2018 to address excess contaminated facilities
- Objective is to characterize and abate hazards, place buildings into a stable condition, and ultimately demolish unneeded facilities
- Enables OREM to reduce its environmental liabilities sooner than originally planned
- Additional funding requested in FY 2019 would allow for continued progress













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
