Subject: Incorporating a 'Dashboard' into DOE's Presentations to the INL

Dear Mr. Cooper,

Liaisons Jim Cooper DDFO, DOE-ID subcommittee on the types of information that should be included in topical presentations made by the Department of Energy Idaho Operations Office (DOE-ID) to the CAB. The purpose of this letter is to summarize the CAB's discussion of information needs and provide a suggested approach for meeting those needs by incorporating the concept of a 'dashboard' into the presentations.

A dashboard is a tool for depicting summary information on the condition of key factors or parameters of interest to an organization. It is intended to assist members of the CAB, and the larger community, receive and process information in the larger context of INL clean-up activities. The indicator or traffic lights for the key factors are red, yellow, and green. The key questions the CAB has identified to be addressed for each topic are the following:

3. What does this mean to the agreement schedule?

4. How does this impact public safety, worker safety, and protection of the environment?

5. How does this impact clean-up across the DOE complex?

We would like each presenter to be provided with these questions before they begin to put their presentations together. Then, at the conclusion of each presentation, we would like to review with the presenter the answers to the questions as a summary.
