6 Background

7 The Order of Consent (CO) was signed on March 1, 2005, by the Los Alamos National Laboratory

8 (LANL), the Department of Energy (DOE), and the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED).(1)

9 In this document, LANL agreed to a schedule for completion of cleanup at various sites on the LANL

10 grounds by December 15, 2015. Since then, LANL has worked diligently to meet the deadlines and 11 milestones established in the CO. For various reasons, there is cleanup work that will not be convoluted.

11 milestones established in the CO. For various reasons, there is cleanup work that will not be completed 12 by that deadline. A revised schedule will need to be established for completing the work that will not be

13 completed by the December 2015 deadline.

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15 The Northern New Mexico Citizens' Advisory Board (NNMCAB) was asked by DOE to provide input 16 on prioritization of projects for the Fiscal Year 2017 budget year. This recommendation is in line with

17 that request.

18 <u>Comments and Observations</u>

19 The New Mexico Environment Department has granted several extensions on clean up milestones that

- are included in the CO; however, there are several efforts (campaigns) that will run well past the
- 21 December 2015 deadline. This recommendation is the NNMCAB's effort at addressing what it has
- 22 determined LANL should focus cleanup efforts on in FY 2017.

23 <u>Recommendation</u>

The NNMCAB recommends that DOE/LANL address the following projects listed in order of priority,
 in the Fiscal Year 2017 budget cycle:

- 26 1. Aggregate Area Prioritized Soil Cleanups.
- 27 2. Aggregate Area Supplemental Investigation Reports (Phase II)
- 28 3. Upper Los Alamos Canyon Cleanup.
- 29 4. MDA L Soil Vapor Extraction (SVE)
- 30 5. TA-21 Building 257 Decontamination and Stability Operations
- 31 6. Initial Aggregate Area Soil Investigations (Phase I)

32 <u>Intent</u>

- 33 It is the intent of the of this recommendation that the NNMCAB have input into developing the budget
- 34 priorities for FY 2017, in order to assist in the completion of clean up scope on the CO requirements.
