33	Dr. Campbell informed the Board that the Executive Committee had approved a public
34	educational forum on regional groundwater issues related to LANL to be hosted by the NNMCAB.

An organizing committee / participant planning group met on 1-24-06. The date for the forum has 35 yet to be finalized. The planning group is considering dates for the forum ranging from April to 36 mid May 2006. The location for the forum is also to be finalized. The planning group is 37 38 considering locations in Los Alamos and Pojoaque. The focus and mission for the forum is to 39 inform and educate the public and to provide a venue for public questions regarding groundwater contamination concerns resulting from 60 years of LANL operations. Dr. Campbell discussed why 40 41 the public might care about the quality of groundwater under LANL. The public has a stake in the quality of the public drinking water supply as well as individual well supply sources. The focus of 42 43 the forum will be on past, current and future impacts of LANL operations on regional groundwater 44 quality, although the Board acknowledges there are other contributors to groundwater contamination. 45

Mr. Timm asked the Board to consider and act upon Draft Resolution 2006-01RS, "to include 28 29 the Northern New Mexico Citizens' Advisory Board in the Award Fee Evaluation Process for the 30 LANL M&O Contractor." The primary author, Mr. Timm, would like the CAB to be included in the "process whereby DOE determines the amount of the award fee earned by the M&O contractor based 31 upon formal performance evaluations and assessments at stated intervals." The Board discussed the 32 33 resolution. Mr. Janis made comments by email dated 1-23-06 stating his appreciation for Mr. Timm's 34 resolution regarding the CAB having input to the new M&O contractor's award fee determination, but 35 he stated concerns that the resolution raises several issues for the CAB. Specifically, the NNMCAB having an input to the new M&O contractor's award fee has (1) no legal precedent, (2) no DOE 36 37 precedent, and (3) may be considered a conflict of interest under the Board's stated charter.

Mr. Janis suggested as an alternative to Mr. Timm's draft resolution that the CAB could consider writing a "report card" for the M&O contractor every 6 or 12 months. The report card could be graded on criteria that the CAB develops within its' purview and independent of the M&O

Contractor's award fees and send this report card to the M&O contractor, to DOE and to the public.
"This would allow the Board to consider factors such as the contractor's attitudes about public

43 involvement and participation that are usually not part of an M&O contractor's award fee

determination." (Full text of comments submitted Mr. Janis regarding Resolution 2006-01RS have been placed on file.)

Mr. Timm agreed that Mr. Janis had good comments but he still wanted the full CAB to review
the resolution and participate in the discussion. Ms. Houston suggested the resolution required further
research prior to the CAB making a final decision. She stated that DOE headquarters wants the CAB

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40	Mat Johansen, DOE:
41	• Mr. Johansen informed the Board that the NMED has requested an Interim Measures
42	Work Plan due in 90 days as a response to the Chromium issue at well R-28. He stated
43	that chromium concentrations were noted in 2004 but that the data was "buried" and
44	was only recently brought to the attention of the appropriate agencies. He further stated
45	that the DOE considered NMED's response to be appropriate and that the Consent
46	Order has contingencies for new findings built into the document.

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11 12 • Mr. Johansen deferred to Mr. Wilmot to address pending questions sent to Mr. Ordaz.

Ken Hargis, LANL:

- Provided the CAB with an update on the process of the Lab's transition to the new contract. The new M&O contractor was announced in December 2005.
- Stated that new format for listing LANL's Consent Order Deliverable status will be available by the January CAB meeting. He passed out the current status of LANL Order Deliverables in the older format to CAB members.
- Mr. Hargis has been working with Ms. Houston and the CAB staff to finalize a formal request process. He is aware of the CAB's outstanding requests and is working with Ms. Bonds-Lopez and others with scheduling and document requests.

James Bearzi, NMED:

- Mr. Bearzi provided comments on the status of additional funding for NMED implementation of the Consent Order from DOE. He thanked the CAB for their recommendation supporting additional funding for NMED. A Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) was executed last fall between the DOE and LANL regarding funding appropriations but that this agreement may have to be renewed on a yearly basis.
 - Mr. Bearzi strongly supported the CAB's upcoming Groundwater Forum. The success of the CAB's Area G Forum has set a strong example.
- Regarding Recommendation 2006-02-- NMED understands the positive aspects of a multi-agency task force, 'bringing the best minds to bear' but stated NMED will only be involved in their current function as a regulatory authority. NMED can only support so many initiatives from the CAB. He stated he wanted the CAB to recognize that 'less can be more.'

30 Section IV- Discussion with Los Alamos Site Manger, Ed Wilmot:

Mr. Wilmot agreed to speak to the CAB at the January 25, 2006 Board meeting to address CAB issues and to make comments regarding recommendations the CAB made to the DOE. Mr. Wilmot stated he has a public participation philosophy for the DOE. He detailed some of his early career working on radioactive waste issues for the Civilian Waste Management Program. Mr. Wilmot stated his responsibilities included planning the transport of spent fuel. He worked at Sandia National Laboratory in the late seventies and helped design TRUPAC containers that are specially built for safely transporting nuclear waste. Throughout the TRUPACS design and implementation process, Mr. Wilmot stressed public involvement. Mr. Wilmot has learned to respect the public process through that experience in Waste Management. Now as a manager he expects public involvement from his staff and he stresses transparency and openness with the decision making process at DOE. He stated that public input could be a valuable tool to everyone involved with DOE's Environmental Management Program.

45 Mr. Wilmot said he wanted to speak to the CAB today to apologize for lack of LASO 46 management involvement with the CAB over the past year. With the recent LAB shutdown 47 and now with a new M&O contractor to begin managing LANL some responsibilities to the 48 CAB have been overlooked in the list of priorities. He admitted that DOE/LASO management had not represented the DOE to the CAB properly. He appreciated Ms. Grace Perez, CAB Vice Chair, and CAB Chair J. D. Campbell's proactive approach in arranging to meet with Mr. Wilmot and explaining the CAB's position. Their recent meeting has helped Mr. Wilmot to understand the CAB's situation. He acknowledged that the CAB has accomplished an incredible amount of work in 2005.

Mr. Wilmot informed the CAB that he instituted a strategic pause to help DOE prepare for the new management at the Lab. He explained that it might appear as a bit of an introduced crisis but Mr. Wilmot stressed that current management systems needed to be examined. To facilitate the strategic pause Mr. Wilmot has re-assigned approximately one third of his staff. The pause should be complete by early March 2006 and at that time, the LASO will regain normal operating tempo.

Mr. Wilmot wanted to specifically address the CAB's 2005 recommendations that have not been responded to by the DOE.
