MINUTES

I. Call to Order, DDFO Introductions

The regular bi-monthly meeting of the Northern New Mexico Citizens' Advisory Board (NNMCAB or CAB) meeting was held on May 13, 2010, at the Ohkay Owingeh Conference Center, Espanola New Mexico. Mr. Bishop, Co-Deputy Designated Federal Officer (DDFO) stated that on behalf of the Department of Energy (DOE), the regular bi-monthly meeting of the NNMCAB was called to order at 9:00 a.m. Mr. Bishop recognized Mr. Ralph Phelps, NNMCAB Chair, who presided. Ms. Lori Isenberg, meeting facilitator, was in attendance. The regular meeting of the NNMCAB was open to the public and posted in **The Federal Register** in accordance with **The Federal Advisory Committee Act**.

II. Welcome and Introductions

Mr. Phelps welcomed everyone to the meeting. He stated his appreciation for all the people in attendance; he noted membership was growing with new faces. Mr. Phelps asked for round robin introductions from the members and guests in attendance. Mr. Phelps went over the public comment process and he mentioned there were two public comment periods scheduled for the meeting. The board would hear a presentation on the "Disposal Authority Statement and Performance Assessment and Composite Analysis (PA/CA)," with Mr. Sean French and Mr. George Henckel, DOE. Additionally, the Board would hold an open forum for members and discuss future draft recommendation topics to the Department of Energy (DOE).

III. Establishment of Quorum (10 needed)

a. Roll Call

Ms. Novak conducted roll call as the members arrived. Twelve members were present at the start of the meeting, which made a quorum for conducting business.

b. Excused Absences

Mr. Worth and Mr. Bishop, Co-DDFOs, had previously approved excused absences for Nicole Castellano, Jacqueline Gutierrez, Lawrence Longacre, Mike Loya and Caroline Mason.

IV. Approval of Agenda

The Board reviewed the May 13, 2010 CAB meeting agenda. Mr. Phelps called for any comments or additions to the agenda. Ms. Santistevan asked the board to add an item regarding forming an Ad Hoc Nominating Committee for the fall Board Officer elections. Mr. Pachecho made a motion to approve the agenda as amended and Ms. Henline seconded the motion. The amended meeting agenda was approved.

V. Approval of Minutes of March 31, 2010

The Board reviewed the minutes from the March 31, 2010 CAB meeting. By ongoing instructions from DOE Headquarters, the minutes were previously reviewed and certified by the NNMCAB Chair, Mr. Ralph Phelps. The minutes were distributed in the mailed meeting packets and were presented at the meeting for Board approval.

Mr. Maestas made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Ms. Gill seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously approved.

VI. Public Comment Period

Mr. Phelps opened the floor for public comment. No one signed up to speak.

VII. Open Forum for New Members

The members held an open discussion; comments are recorded in the taped transcription of the minutes.

Open forum topics included:

- Assistant Secretary for DOE/ Environmental Management Ines Triay to visit Los Alamos for a Memorandum of Agreement with the Buckman Direct Diversion Project and receive a "Key to the City" from the Los Alamos County Council.
- Discussed well construction and data quality issues for monitoring wells, also ways to annotate data in the data quality waterbase.
- Maintaining wetlands in Los Alamos to stabilize Chromium 6 contamination by reduction to Chromium 3; discussed possible alternatives, this item could be brought back to committee for a subject matter expert presentation.
- Discussed the Lab's goal of zero discharge
- Considered ways to get more pueblo participation, considering pueblos already have a government to government relationship with the DOE, this CAB extends an open invitation for pueblo participation.
- ❖ Discussed the NNMCAB Speaker's Bureau Outreach Program, which was available to any interested members to use to conduct outreach. Additionally, NNMCAB has a ready-to-go informational table display, brochure and public relations materials. Noted that Ms. Mason recently gave the Speaker's Bureau presentation to the Los Alamos League of Women's Voters. Also, Ms. Novak had a table at Los Alamos Earth Day Festival, the Santa Fe Renewable Energy Conference, and has been invited to be interviewed regarding the CAB's mission with KRSN Radio, Los Alamos, and has another public outreach table planned for the MDA-B Open House in Los Alamos. Mr. Bishop asked for volunteers to sit at the booth.
- ❖ Announced Mr. Mike Loya attended the Environmental Justice Conference. Mr. Bishop explained that Environmental Justice was a new area to determine if a specific region or group was more disproportionately impacted and works on developing alternatives and positive outcomes.

Mr. Maestas, WM Committee Chair, wanted to see subject matter

presentations focus on topics that will help the board to become better educated on issues related to their mission in order to make more informed recommendations to the DOE.

 Ms. Henline, EMSR Committee Chair, was interested in a presentation on EM Program recycling efforts.

Mr. Bishop addressed the board. He stated the board has come a long way, board meetings have been productive and the membership was communicating well, and functioning according to its charter. Public Outreach efforts have increased, and they are looking at public radio and public meeting announcements for marquees.

 Mr. Bishop opened the floor to the membership for a brainstorming planning session to generate ideas for the upcoming SSAB meeting to be held in Santa Fe in September 2010. The meeting will be hosted by the NNMCAB and Ms. Santistevan has arranged the government hotel rate at the La Fonda Hotel on the Plaza. The event occurs simultaneously with the 400 anniversary of the City of Santa Fe and Mr. Bishop wanted to include information about these activities for the other SSAB attendees. The Environmental Management Advisory Board (EMAB) will hold its semi-annual meeting concurrently in Santa Fe also at La Fonda.

Mr. Phelps explained that a number of the board members have been to past meetings and that the whole board was welcome to attend the meeting in Santa Fe.

Two members of this board, generally the Chair and Vice Chair, would actually sit at the table and participate in the meeting. He explained the schedule included one day of site tours, with is the first day ending in a social reception type of event and the second and third days were for meetings and presentations from DOE Headquarters on site wide issues and the top three issues generated from each site. The group discussed ideas for the meeting, from hosting a reception at the Palace of the Governors, to inviting the Mayor of Santa Fe to open the meeting, to including a stop at the Pueblo Ruins during the site tour. The agenda would be a developed and finalized through a series of conference calls with the site Chairs and DOE/HQ. Mr. Bishop stated one major goal for the meeting planning was to develop a package of possible activities. Mr. Bishop stressed the LASO office's intention was to host not a good meeting but a fabulous one!

X. Discussed Future Draft Recommendation Topics to the Department of Energy

The board discussed potential recommendations in development. The first topic discussed was brought up by Ms. Henline regarding American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funding. The draft recommendation would focus on any surplus ARRA funding that could be allocated to Los Alamos. Mr. Worth thought this would be an appropriate recommendation for the board because the Lab has "shovel ready" projects that could benefit from additional funding. Mr. Bishop said it was a good idea to state outright that the Environmental Management (EM) Programs at LASO were on schedule and they have more work ready. Ms. Henline agreed to make a first draft of the recommendation.

Mr. Maestas was interested in considering possible recommendations (after hearing subject matter presentations) on the following topics:

- > Technical Area 49
- Material Disposal Area T
- ➤ End State for Technical Area 21, i.e. whether to clean-up to industrial or residential standards.

Dr. Shaw made a motion for the Chair to prepare a letter of commendation for the Co-DDFO's regarding the positive work they have accomplished with the CAB. The letter was to be sent to Ms. Cate Brennan, DFO, and endorsed by the whole NNMCAB. Ms. Henline seconded the motion. The board discussed the motion and thought it was a great idea. Dr. Shaw stated her motivation was that everyone gets performance reviews from time to time. The Chair supported the idea and agreed to draft the letter of commendation. The motion passed unanimously.

Assessment and Composite Analysis (PA/CA)

Established DOE Authority under the Atomic Energy Act:

Establish by rule, regulation, or order, such standards and instructions to govern the possession and use of special nuclear material, source material, and byproduct material as the Commission may deem necessary or desirable to promote the common defense and security or to protect health or to minimize danger to life or property

The presenters answered questions from the board. Mr. Phelps thanked all the presenters and stated putting together this very detailed and informative presentation was a huge effort, which was much appreciated by the board. Mr. Phelps announced that the PA/CA was available for review on the LANL website. The board would also have access to the PA/CA on CD available from the CAB office.

XII. Public Comment Period

Mr. Phelps announced the board was prepared for public comment. Dr. J. D. Campbell, Taos, signed up for public comment. Dr. Campbell was a past member of the CAB. He stated he wanted to remain as a public member on the technical committees of the CAB. Dr. Campbell said he was encouraged by the PA/CA presentation. A positive piece of news for him was that there were no groundwater exposure scenarios for the 1000-year period; positive but contrary to what the public may expect. He would like to see the model enhanced even further and be used to defend the engineered cap alternative. He stated by using these exposure scenarios to validate the modeling over time, that these findings could add to public confidence.

XIII. Closing Comments and Meeting Feedback

Mr. Phelps invited the board to provide feedback on the meeting.

Dr. Medinski commented on communicating information to the public. She thought Mr. deSousa's video and the one page informational PA/CA handout were both great distillations of the modeling efforts.

Ms. Henline suggested the video be put on the web. Mr. Bishop stated they would have the video on the web and that they were pursuing having information on some of

the social networking sites, i.e. Facebook, Twitter and LANS already has videos for view on YouTube.

Mr. Phelps commented on the remaining uncertainties in the realm of modeling and he wanted to find a way to fold this uncertainty into the model presentation. Mr. Phelps also thanked the CAB staff for their work.

Rev. Gilchrist said it was a good meeting and there was agreement from all around the table.

Mr. Valdez wanted to thank the Los Alamos staff and he also thanked the CAB staff for putting together a good meeting.

Ms. Santistevan thanked everyone for volunteering their time. She explained that Ms. Isenberg, meeting facilitator, had to leave early because her granddaughter was born. She made sure to mention that she was amazed by the NNMCAB. Ms. Isenberg planned to send kind words back to DOE about the effectiveness and quality of this board and its membership.

Mr. Worth thanked the members for their time, he knew it was a big effort and the DOE appreciated and valued the board's input. He informed the board that he and Mr. Bishop were accessible to the members.
