Dear Ms. Steele:

The U.S. Department of Energy ("DOE") selected a Kenmore-brand dehumidifier, model 90701, for testing as part of DOE's ENERGY STAR® Verification Testing Program. On March 18, 2013, DOE notified the manufacturer of this model, [REDACTED], that the model did not meet the minimum energy factor required for a model of its capacity according to the applicable ENERGY STAR specification.

[REDACTED] replied to, and later spoke with, DOE representatives about DOE's results. [REDACTED] also provided test data from previous testing of this model; the test data provided documented a higher energy factor than that observed in the DOE testing. [REDACTED] could not, however, point out any concerns with the DOE testing beyond the inconsistency of the results.

Based on DOE's test results, DOE has therefore determined that Kenmore-brand dehumidifier model 90701 does not meet the applicable ENERGY STAR specification. Accordingly, DOE is referring this matter to the Environmental Protection Agency, the brand manager for ENERGY STAR.
