## What is the Purpose of this Acquisition Letter?

The purpose of this Acquisition Letter (AL) is to revise the core career path curriculum for certification in the contracting career field under the Acquisition Career Development Program thus incorporating **Earned Value Management and Performance Based Service Acquisition** into the core requirements.

## What is the Background?

The DOE Acquisition Career Development (ACD) Program is modeled after the Department of Defense (DOD) acquisition career development program, as it is considered one of the most comprehensive in the Federal Government. DOD recently revised its certification program for GS-1102s to provide a more business-focused approach that emphasizes the role of the contracting officer as business advisor and focuses on understanding and supporting the customer's mission. Because the DOE certification program is modeled after, and is analogous, to the DOD curriculum, the DOE curriculum is similarly being revised. The ACD, as modified, also provides the GS-1102 workforce in-depth training in such areas as earned value management and performance-based contracting.

#### What are the revisions to the ACD Program Curriculum?

#### **Revised Core Curriculum**

As described in DOE Order 361.1A, Chapter I, Section 5 paragraph a, the table of core courses is amended as follows:

### **Assignment-specific Requirement**

Level II - Any GS-1102 requiring certification to Level II having responsibility for a project which requires an earned value management system must take a course in Earned Value Management in order to attain certification. All other GS-1102s requiring certification to Level II may take either a course in earned value management or in performance-based contracting.

Level III - Individuals and supervisors are encouraged to discuss which of the three assignment-specific courses would be most appropriate given the individual's current and projected assignments.

Note: Individuals certified to Level II and III on the effective date of this AL retain their certification regardless of the new requirements.
