Energy



Nevada National Security Site successfully commissioned a new **424 kW solar array** at their Mercury Fire Station, making it the first NNSS zero energy facility.




Pacific Northwest National Laboratory implemented a voting-based temperature control system - **saving 1,400 MMbtu with a cost savings of over \$3,600.**



Hanford Site reinvested energy incentives into additional energy efficiency projects saving 1,217 MWh of energy and \$50,000 in cost avoidance.*







Savannah River Site established a small drone program to inspect a decommissioned reactor providing quick inspections at half the cost of a helicopter and using no fossil fuels.

Waste Diversion



Argonne National Laboratory launched a food scrap and paper towel composting program, which is expected to **increase their municipal solid waste (MSW) diversion rate by 24%.**



Y-12 National Security Complex/NNSA's authorized limits partnership maximized complexwide sustainability recycling - efficiently and safely reducing waste, improving operations, and avoiding significant costs.*



Argonne National Laboratory initiated a labwide program called Disposal Days - **diverting** 66 tons of electronics/scrap metal from landfill, and disposing of 24 tons of MSW.*
