### RECORD OF CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATION

Willoby Substation Construction Project, Weld County, Colorado

- A. Brief Description of Proposal: Western proposes to construct the new 115-kilovolt (kV) Willoby Substation in Weld County, Colorado. The proposed substation would replace the Prospect Valley Tap structures at the juncture of the existing Kiowa Creek Weld 115-kV Transmission line and the Prospect Valley-Prospect Valley Tap 115-kV Transmission Line. The project area can be identified on the Hardin, Colorado 7.5' USGS Quadrangle map.
- B. Number and Title of the Categorical Exclusion Being Applied: (See text in 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D.) B4.11. Construction of electrical power substation (including switching stations and support facilities) with power delivery at 230-kV or below, or modification (other than voltage increases) of existing substations and support facilities, that could involve the construction of electric powerlines approximately 10 miles in length or less, or relocation of existing powerlines approximately 20 miles in length or less, but not the integration of major new generation resources into a main transmission system.
- C. Regulatory Requirements in 10 CFR 1021.410 (b): (See full text in regulation and attached checklist (Attachment A).)
  - 1) The proposed action fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix B to Subpart D.

For classes of actions listed in Appendix B, the following conditions are integral elements; i.e., to fit within a class, the proposal must not:

- Threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, including DOE and/or Executive Orders;
- Require siting, construction, or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities, but may include such categorically excluded facilities;
- Disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or CERCLA-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases; or
- Adversely affect environmentally sensitive resources (including but not limited to those listed in paragraph B.(4)). 1
- 2) There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- 3) The proposal is not "connected" to other actions with potentially significant impacts, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impacts, and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211.

## D. Determination:

Based on my review of information provided to me and in my possession concerning the proposed action, I determined that the proposed action fits within the specified class of actions, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is categorically excluded from requirements for an EIS.
