Categorical Exclusion for the blading of washed out access road and repairing the washed out area inside the substation fence. These actions will take place on the existing access road West of the Peacock Substation located in Mohave County, AZ.

RECORD OF CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATION

A. <u>Proposed Action:</u> Western proposes to conduct maintenance on access roads leading to the Peacock Substation. All work will be done along existing access roads. This will consist of blading and leveling the washed out areas of the existing access roads.

The attached map shows the project area situated within Section 36 Township 22 North, Range 14 West on the Gila and Salt River Baseline and Meridian, Mohave County, Arizona. The right-of-way crosses private land. The corresponding U.S.G.S. 7.5-minute topographic maps are Hackberry and Tin Mountain NW, Arizona. This work is to begin the week of November 16, 2009.

B. <u>Categorical Exclusion Applied:</u> 10 CFR, Part 1021, Subpart D, Appendix B,B1.3: "Routine maintenance activities and custodial services for buildings, structures, right-of-way, infrastructures (e.g. pathways, roads and railroads), vehicles and equipment and localized vegetation and pest control during which operations may be suspended and resumed."

C. Regulatory Requirements in 10 CFR 1021.410 (b):

- The proposed action fits within a class of actions that is listed in Appendix B to Subpart D.
 - a. The proposed action was reviewed for the requirements of the Endangered Species Act, the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the National Historic Preservation Act, and all applicable Department of Energy Orders. This action falls under the Programmatic Agreement for routine maintenance activities, type II activities.
 - b. The proposed action does not require the siting, construction, or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities.
 - c. The proposed action does not disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminates, or CERLA-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled and unpermitted releases.
 - d. The proposed action was reviewed and surveyed for impacts to cultural and sensitive biological resources. Cultural and sensitive biological resources have been determined to not be affected.

- 2. There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- 3. The proposal is not "connected" to other actions with potentially significant impacts, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impacts, and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211.
- D. <u>Determination</u>: Based on my review of information conveyed to me and in my possession (or attached) concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (as authorized under DOE Order 451.1A), I have determined that the proposed action fits within the specified class of actions, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is hereby categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
- E. <u>Special Conditions:</u> If fill dirt comes from an outside source, it needs to be ADOT approved materials.
