Description:

B5.1 Actions to conserve energy, demonstrate potential energy conservation, and promote energy-efficiency that do not increase the indoor concentrations of potentially harmful substances. These actions may involve financial and technical assistance to individuals (such as builders, owners, consultants, designers), organizations (such as utilities), and state and local governments. Covered actions include, but are not limited to: programmed lowering of thermostat settings, placement of timers on hot water heaters, installation of solar hot water systems, installation of efficient lighting, improvements in generator efficiency and appliance efficiency ratings, development of energy-efficient manufacturing or industrial practices, and small-scale conservation and renewable energy research and development and pilot projects. The actions could involve building renovations or new structures in commercial, residential, agricultural, or industrial sectors. ## Rational for determination:

The State of Wisconsin will provide \$595,000 in Recovery Act funds in the form of a low interest loan to Ace Ethanol, LLC (Ace) for the purchase of a heat exchange system at the Ace facility located at 815 W. Maple Street, Stanley, WI 54768.

The project will take place in an existing building and will require no construction that would affect the footprint of the building or adversely impact the operations of the facility. The project involves the purchase of heat exchange equipment that will be installed as part of Ace's regenerative thermal oxidizer (RTO) unit. The heat exchanger will recover waste heat from the RTO for reuse as process heat.

Installation and operation of the heat exchanger will not require new permits or licenses at the facility. The company has the following operation permits:
