## I. Project Title:

Herbicide Applications along Gravel and Paved Roads on the Hanford Site

II. Project Description and Location (including time period over which proposed action will occur and project dimensions - e.g., acres displaced/disturbed, excavation length/depth, etc.):

The Mission Support Alliance (MSA) Biological Controls organization routinely applies herbicides on gravel roads and along the shoulders of paved roads on the Hanford Site to control vegetation and maintain critical fire breaks. These roadways are initially sprayed with non-selective herbicides to remove all vegetation. Follow-up spot spraying with selective herbicides is performed, as needed, to control vegetation that grows in treated areas.

All herbicide spraying is conducted with ground-based equipment (i.e., backpack hand spraying, all-terrain vehicle/pickup mounted spray equipment, commercial boom-type sprayers, etc.). All herbicides are applied in strict accordance with manufacturer label requirements and MSA procedures by Chemical Operators and Commercial Pesticide Applicators licensed in the State of Washington.

The primary time period over which herbicides are applied is from October through April. Follow-up spot spraying is conducted from April through September, as needed, to control vegetation that grows in treated areas.

An ecological resources review was completed and documented in an electronic mail message from M. R. Sackschewsky to Distribution, "Request for Ecological Resource Review Clearance," dated August 5, 2010. The application of herbicides to graveled roads and along the shoulders of paved roads is not likely to have ecological impacts subject to the following constraints:

- Road shoulders are the maintained, graveled edges of paved roads that rarely extend beyond 10 feet of the edge of the pavement. Herbicide spraying shall not occur beyond 10 feet from the edge of the pavement.
- Gravel road edges are defined by the edge of the applied gravel. Herbicide spraying shall not occur beyond the edge of the placed gravel.
- Herbicide spraying on gravel roads or along the shoulders of paved roads shall be by hand or ground-based equipment. Aerial application methods are not allowed.
- Vegetation control on two-track or other unimproved dirt roads is not covered by the ecological resource review clearance.

A cultural resources review was completed and documented in an electronic mail message from E. Prendergast-Kennedy to Distribution, "Request for Cultural Resource Review Clearance, dated August 5, 2010. Spraying of herbicides along the shoulders of paved roads and on graveled roads is exempt from cultural resource review. All roads, whether they are paved, graveled, or dirt, that are located on Gable Mountain, Gable Butte, and Rattlesnake Mountain are not covered by this exemption. There is a blanket review covering Gable Mountain and Gable Butte, but there are specific requirements for performing this work (see DOE/RL-2008-17, "Gable Mountain and Gable Butte Resource Management Plan"). Any spraying along the roads on Rattlesnake Mountain is subject to a Memorandum of Agreement for the CH2M Hill Plateau Remediation Company (CHPRC) and Energy Northwest (ENW) work on the Fitzner-Eberhardt Arid Land Ecology (ALE) Reserve which also has specific requirements, such as monitoring, tribal notifications, and cultural sensitivity training. Spraying along dirt roads is not covered by this cultural resource review clearance and must be evaluated separately since the potential for cultural resources exists in these areas.
