Proposed Action: Anaconda Substation 3G Radio Upgrades

Budget Information: Work Order # 00197234, Task 03

<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.19 "Siting, construction, and operation of microwave and radio communication towers and associated facilities..."

Location: Deer Lodge County, Montana (Township 4 North, Range 10 West, Section 17)

Proposed by: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA)

Description of the Proposed Action: BPA proposes to install a new monopole radio tower and associated communication upgrades at the existing BPA Anaconda Substation in Deer Lodge County, Montana. The monopole tower would be about 30 feet tall and would be installed within the gravel substation yard, adjacent to the substation control house. BPA would install antenna systems on the tower, and route communications lines from the tower into the existing substation control house where they would connect into a communication rack. Any additional communications equipment work related to this project would occur within existing BPA facilities. All ground disturbing activities would occur within the graveled electrical yard on BPA fee-owned property, which can be easily accessed via maintained roads.

BPA must vacate radio frequencies in the 1710-1755 MHz band to comply with a Federal law mandating reallocation of frequencies to be used for advanced wireless networks. The proposed work is required to transition the affected telecommunications systems onto new digital microwave radio frequencies or onto fiber optic infrastructure, and to ensure communications reliability by replacing outdated facilities. The radio equipment would be part of a radio hop linking several existing radio sites within the power systems control communications network for the BPA transmission system. The proposed work is scheduled for summer 2011.

Findings: BPA has determined that the proposed action complies with Section 1021.410 and Appendix B of Subpart D of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996). The proposed action does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal. The proposal is not connected [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(1)] to other actions with

potentially significant impacts, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impacts [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(2)], and is not precluded by 40 C.F.R. 1506.1 or 10 C.F.R. 1021.211. Moreover, the proposed action would not (i) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, (ii) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities, (iii) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases, or (iv) adversely affect environmentally sensitive resources.

This proposed action meets the requirements for the Categorical Exclusion referenced above. We therefore determine that the proposed action may be categorically excluded from further NEPA review and documentation.
