Based on my review of the information concerning the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (authorized under DOE Order 451.1A), I have made the following determination:

Description:

- A9 Information gathering (including, but not limited to, literature surveys, inventories, audits), data analysis (including computer modeling), document preparation (such as conceptual design or feasibility studies, analytical energy supply and demand studies), and dissemination (including, but not limited to, document mailings, publication, and distribution; and classroom training and informational programs), but not including site characterization or environmental monitoring.
- B5.1 Actions to conserve energy, demonstrate potential energy conservation, and promote energy-efficiency that do not increase the indoor concentrations of potentially harmful substances. These actions may involve financial and technical assistance to individuals (such as builders, owners, consultants, designers), organizations (such as utilities), and state and local governments. Covered actions include, but are not limited to: programmed lowering of thermostat settings, placement of timers on hot water heaters, installation of solar hot water systems, installation of efficient lighting, improvements in generator efficiency and appliance efficiency ratings, development of energy-efficient manufacturing or industrial practices, and small-scale conservation and renewable energy research and development and pilot projects. The actions could involve building renovations or new structures in commercial, residential, agricultural, or industrial sectors. These actions do not include rulemakings, standard-settings, or proposed DOE legislation.

Rational for determination:

Tennessee Energy Efficient Schools Initiative GSHP Program proposes to install a series of Ground Source Heat Pumps which will service; Brainerd High School, South Lawrence Elementary, Lawrence Public High School, Bolivar High School. Phase 1 for all four schools was approved by GFO-10-294 on March 23, 2010.

This NEPA Determination is specific to Phase 2 and 3 for Lawrence Public High School and South Lawrence Elementary only. These schools had used their own finances to previously install a horizontal loop field adjacent to their facilities within the contiguous school property. Any new soil disturbance would be limited to the trenching required for the schools to connect the existing loop field to the hybrid heat exchanging systems.

Phase 2 of the project includes only the equipment purchases, installation, commissioning, and cost reporting for two hybrid heat exchanger systems which would tie in the existing loop field to both the existing HVAC system and boiler. The heat exchanger system would provide for a combination of rooftop units, interior vertical or horizontal units and console type units. Phase 3 consists of data collection and project reporting.

Funds associated with Phase 2 and Phase 3:

- South Lawrence: \$246,673 (DOE), \$173,586 (Cost Share)
- Lawrence Public: \$246,673 (DOE), \$171,884 (Cost Share)

- Lawrence Public: \$96,443 (Cost Share)
- Phase 3: \$93,000

Silt fencing and/or other protective devices would be used per state guidelines for all ground disturbing activities. These areas are already highly disturbed from the development of the school grounds. The sites are not located in or near a floodplain or wetland. The sites would be restored to previous grade and the area would be replanted with grass after construction. Exact requirements for erosion control will be determined by the design engineer prior to any construction and will comply with all federal, state and local requirements.

The actions involved with the proposed projects are consistent with activities as outlined in CX A9 and B5.1. After a review of the information provided, it has been determined that the project as outlined above will not have a significant impact on human health and/or environment; therefore, they are categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
