<u>Proposed Action</u>: Granting Verizon Wireless permission to route approximately 2900 feet of fiber across fee-owned land from McVay Highway to their existing equipment pad located at Bonneville Power Administration's (BPA) tower 1/5 on the Alvey-Fairview transmission line.

<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B4.7 Burying fiber optic cable. Adding fiber optic cable to transmission structures or burying fiber optic cable in existing transmission line rights-of-way.

Location: Section 14; Township 18S; Range 3W – Willamette Meridian in Lane County, Oregon.

Proposed by: BPA

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: Verizon Wireless' fiber will be routed through 2 inch plastic conduit trenched to a depth of 36 inches that would be located immediately adjacent to an existing access road and within an existing utility easement. A portion of the project crosses BPA fee-owned property at Tracts GOSHN-SS-P5A and P6A.

Findings: BPA has determined that the proposed action complies with Section 1021.410 and Appendix B of Subpart D of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, April 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996). The proposed action does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal. The proposal is not connected [40 C.F.R 1508.25(a) (1)] to other action with potentially significant impacts, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impact [40 C.F.R. 1508(a) (2)], and is not precluded by 40 C.F.R. 1506.1 or 10 C.F.R. 1021.211. Moreover, the proposed action would not (i) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, (ii) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities, (iii) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or

Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act - excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted release, or (iv) adversely affect environmentally sensitive resources. The proposal will not affect any listed threatened or endangered species, or critical habitat under the Endangered Species Act, or Essential Fish Habitat under the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act, or historic properties under the National Historic Preservation Act.

This proposed action meets the requirements for the Categorical Exclusion referenced above. We therefore determine that the proposed action may be categorically excluded from further NEPA review and documentation.
