Proposed Action: Environmental protection system upgrades at pole storage facility at Alvey Maintenance Headquarters.

Budget Information: Work Order #00283226

<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (Appendix B to Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B4.6: Additions or modifications to electric power transmission facilities that would not affect the environment beyond the previously developed facility area including, but not limited to, switchyard rock grounding upgrades, secondary containment projects, paving projects, seismic upgrading, tower modifications, changing insulators, and replacement of poles, circuit breakers, conductors, transformers, and crossarms.

Location: Secondary containment systems will be upgraded at Alvey Maintenance Headquarters in Lane County, Oregon. PLS T18S R3W S14, Lat-Long 43 59 56.1N 123 00 51.7W

Proposed by: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA)

Description of the Proposed Action: BPA proposes to upgrade the secondary containment system for the protection of stormwater runoff and protection of environmental resources at Alvey Maintenance Headquarters. The work will take place on the previously disturbed and existing pole storage facility behind the Mechanic Shop. The intent of the project is to provide improved capture of utility pole leachate.

The existing pole storage facility will be enhanced by grading and rocking and installing a functional drainage system to direct stormflow from the pole yard into a new containment installation. The system will be sized to handle the stormflow anticipated from the improved pole storage yard.

Two precast concrete vaults will be installed down gradient from the pole storage facility, along with associated piping to connect the area of protection to the vaults. This will ensure that potential leachate will be captured for proper management.

Findings: BPA has determined that the proposed action complies with Section 1021.410 and Appendix B of Subpart D of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, April 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996). The proposed action does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal. The

proposal is not connected [40 C.F.R 1508.25(a)(1)] to other action with potentially significant impacts, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impact [40 C.F.R. 1508(a)(2)], and is not precluded by 40 C.F.R. 1506.1 or 10 C.F.R. 1021.211.

Moreover, the proposed action would not (i) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, (ii) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities, (iii) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act - excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted release, or (iv) adversely affect environmentally sensitive resources. The proposal will not affect any listed threatened or endangered species, or critical habitat under the Endangered Species Act, or Essential Fish Habitat under the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act, or historic properties under the National Historic Preservation Act.

All proposed actions meet the requirements for the Categorical Exclusion referenced above. We therefore determine that the proposed actions at the nine reviewed Substations may be categorically excluded from further NEPA review and documentation.
