Proposed Action: AMENDED: Acquisition of a portion of Cowlitz County Public Utility District's (CCPUD) 115-kV transmission line from BPA's Longview Substation to CCPUD's Washington Way Substation

Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021): B1.24 Property Transfers

Location: Township 8 North, Range 3 West, Section 36, and Township 8 North, Range 2 West, Sections 31 and 32 in Cowlitz County, Washington

Proposed by: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA)

Description of the Proposed Action: BPA proposes to acquire a 1.5 mile portion of CCPUD's existing Longview-Washington Way 115-kV transmission line in order to provide a parallel transmission path for its existing Longview-Cowlitz No. 1 transmission line and to comply with North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC)/Western Electricity Coordinating Council (WECC) reliability standards. Amending a February 24, 2012, environmental clearance memorandum, BPA also proposes to enter into an operation and maintenance agreement with CCPUD for the Longview-Washington Way line.

In 2010, thermal overload conditions affected BPA's existing Longview-Cowlitz 115-kV No. 1 transmission line, impacting CCPUD's system at the time. BPA and CCPUD had previously developed a mitigation plan for such overloads, which are not allowed per NERC standards. The mitigation plan provides for a new 115-kV line circuit between BPA's Longview and Cowlitz Substation, providing a secondary 115-kV transmission path (circuit) for power to flow on. This new circuit would satisfy NERC/WECC standards. CCPUD has agreed to sell a portion of its 115-kV circuit, between Longview-Washington Way to BPA. BPA would be the transmission operator of the line while CCPUD would perform maintenance, including vegetation management on the line from BPA's Longview Substation to its Washington Way Substation. As part of the operation and maintenance agreement, CCPUD would provide notice to BPA when it plans to perform work at BPA's Longview Substation.

Findings: BPA has determined that the proposed action complies with Section 1021.410 and Appendix B of Subpart D of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011). The proposed action does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the

environmental effects of the proposal. The proposal is not connected [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(1)] to other actions with potentially significant impacts, has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impacts [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(2)], and is not precluded by 40 C.F.R. 1506.1 or 10 C.F.R. 1021.211. Moreover, the proposed action would not (i) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, (ii) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities, (iii) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases, (iv) have the potential to cause significant impacts on environmentally sensitive resources, or (v) involve genetically engineered organisms, synthetic biology, governmentally designated noxious weeds, or invasive species, unless the proposed activity would be contained or confined in a manner designed and operated to prevent unauthorized release into the environment and conducted in accordance with applicable requirements.

This proposed action meets the requirements for the Categorical Exclusion referenced above. We therefore determine that the proposed action may be categorically excluded from further NEPA review and documentation.
