Rational for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) provided funding to the Washington Department of Commerce (WDOC) under the DOE's American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 State Energy Program (SEP). WDOC selected Cedar Grove Composting, Inc. (Cedar Grove) to receive \$655,052 in SEP funding (total project cost - \$19,378,610).

Cedar Grove is proposing to use federal funding for permitting costs (and associated legal fees), technology selection, feedstock commitments and contracts, preliminary engineering and design, site layout, and air emission modeling for its proposed 50,000 ton per year high solids Anaerobic Digester system at their current 26 acre composting facility at 3620 36th PI NE, City of Everett, WA 98205.

Based on a review of the proposed activities, DOE has determined they will not have significant individual or cumulative impacts on the human environment and do not enable construction or operation of the proposed anaerobic digester facility. DOE has determined the activities meet the definition of DOE categorical exclusion A9 "information gathering" and B3.1 "environmental monitoring" and are categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
