Rational for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) provided \$254,000 of federal funding to the State of New Hampshire under the DOE's Annually Appropriated State Energy Program (SEP) for 2012. New Hampshire will match the federal funding with \$154,065 in state funds. Additionally, New Hampshire will carry over \$163,770 in federal appropriations, for a total of \$571,835.

New Hampshire proposes to fund the following Market Titles:

Building Improvements:

Under this Market Title, the funding would be utilized to provide administrative oversight of a third-party administered ARRA revolving loan fund. It also includes tracking energy data from the projects funded through the loan program, and technical assistance training to state agencies to develop required energy conservation plans. New Hampshire would also issue an RFP for the Energy Code Compliance Roadmap.

Energy Education:

Under this Market Title, New Hampshire would provide energy education services to municipalities, State employees and agencies, business and residential markets through conferences, trainings and the New Hampshire energy information website.

NH Electric Power and Renewable Energy Program:

Under this Market Title, funding would be used to meet State goals of meeting the Renewable Portfolio Standard, serving on the Site Evaluation Committee to ensure proper siting for fossil fuel and renewable energy projects, and support renewable energy and energy storage related business activities in the state.

NH Energy Policy, Planning and Security:

Under this Market Title, New Hampshire would provide direct assistance to citizens and businesses to advance energy efficiency and renewable energy. The program would focus on five key areas: Technical assistance, strategic planning, legislative support, program support and energy security.

Transportation Program:

Under this Market Title, funding would be utilized to increase awareness of alternatives fuels with fleet managers from state, municipal, educational and private fleets. This would also include enhancing the Granite State Clean Cities Collaborative through building relationships with fleet managers and strengthening connections with industry vendors and consultants.
