Proposed Action Title: Parker-Gila (PADGLA) 161kV transmission line - Structure 109-8 Relocation

Program or Field Office: Western Area Power Administration, Desert Southwest Regional Office

Location(s) (City/County/State): Yuma County, Arizona

Proposed Action Description:

The proposed project is located along Western's Parker-Gila 161kV existing transmission line in Yuma County, Arizona. The project is on lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) in Section 3, Township 8 South, Range 21 West.

Western proposes to install a new 230-kV wood H-frame structure adjacent to the existing 161-kV steel H-frame structure 109-8 and rotate the new wood H-frame structure such that the spacing and crossarms are parallel to the Wellton Mohawk canal road. The current structure has suffered damage numerous times due to vehicular collisions. Concrete jersey barriers installed around the structure have failed to prevent damage. The purpose of the proposed project is to orient the structure, and modify the size, such that the structure is no longer an impediment to traffic on the canal road.

Work and setup will be conducted within Western's 100-foot easement at the structure. Equipment will be set up on either side of the structure and may include crew trucks, line trucks, bucket truck, and auger. The existing steel structure will be removed, and the new structure will be embedded at its new position within approximately 5 feet of the current location. The use of excavated native material will be used to fill in the structure holes. The road is approximately 30 feet wide at the project location which will require a temporary closure of a 75-foot area with surrounding concrete barricades to perform the work. The temporary work closure to be completed within a week and Western Maintenance will coordinate with land owner. Special Conditions (NONE).

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

Based on my review of the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (as authorized under DOE Order 451.1B), I have determined that the proposed action fits within the specified class(es) of action, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is hereby categorically excluded from further NEPA review.


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

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





