Proposed Action: Equipment and Property Transfers in Idaho (update to previous categorical exclusion, "Equipment and Property Transfers with Three Public Utilities in Oregon, Idaho and Washington," issued December 26, 2013)

Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021): B1.24 Property Transfers

Location: The City of Bonner's Ferry, Idaho

Proposed by: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA)

Description of the Proposed Action: The previous categorical exclusion addressed the sale of outdoor equipment located in the City of Bonners Ferry's Moyie Substation to the City of Bonners Ferry. In addition to the sale of outdoor equipment described in the previous categorical exclusion, BPA also proposes to sell the following:

- Three 230-kV and over current transformers, potential transformers, and potential devices
- Three 15-kV current transformers (correction from 11-5kV potential transformers described in previous CX)
- One 6/8 megavar power transformer
- All 115-kV structures and supports
- One wood, all-clad substation metering and control house
- All indoor switches, panels and relays
- One positron

All the additional equipment is also located within the existing Moyie Substation.

Findings: BPA has determined that the proposed action complies with Section 1021.410 and Appendix B of Subpart D of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011). The proposed action does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal. The proposal is not connected [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(1)] to other actions with potentially significant impacts, has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively

significant impacts [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(2)], and is not precluded by 40 C.F.R. 1506.1 or 10 C.F.R. 1021.211. Moreover, the proposed action would <u>not</u> (i) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, (ii) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities, (iii) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases, (iv) have the potential to cause significant impacts on environmentally sensitive resources, or (v) involve genetically engineered organisms, synthetic biology, governmentally designated noxious weeds, or invasive species, unless the proposed activity would be contained or confined in a manner designed and operated to prevent unauthorized release into the environment and conducted in accordance with applicable requirements.

This proposed action meets the requirements for the Categorical Exclusion referenced above. We therefore determine that the proposed action may be categorically excluded from further NEPA review and documentation.
