Proposed Action: Davis Creek Tap Wood Pole Replacement Project

PP&A Project No.: 2872

<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.3 Routine Maintenance

<u>Location</u>: Structure 1/1 on the Davis Creek Tap transmission line located in Modoc County, California.

Proposed by: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA)

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: BPA is proposing to replace one deteriorating wood-pole structure on its Davis Creek Tap 115-kV (kilovolt) transmission line located in Modoc County, California. The structure is located in a residential neighborhood.

The proposed maintenance involves replacement of the wood-pole structure, which consists of two vertical poles and one cross arm. Additionally the associated structural/electrical components (i.e. cross arms, insulators, guys and guy anchors, etc.) would be replaced. The existing wood poles would be mechanically removed from the ground using a line truck and replaced with an in-kind structure having the same height as the original.

The work may include creating a 50- by 50-foot earthen landing adjacent to the structure to allow equipment staging for pole removal and replacement. New poles would be placed back in the existing holes. During the line outage, the existing poles would then be removed and the new poles installed in the existing or pre-drilled holes. Ground disturbance for each pole replacement would not extend beyond a 100-foot radius around existing pole structures. No access road improvement would be needed for this project.

The project is proposed to begin in October-2014.

<u>Findings</u>: BPA has determined that the proposed action complies with Section 1021.410 and Appendix B of Subpart D of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011). The proposed action does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the

environmental effects of the proposal. The proposal is not connected [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(1)] to other actions with potentially significant impacts, has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion, is not related to other proposed actions with cumulatively significant impacts [40 C.F.R. 1508.25(a)(2)], and is not precluded by 40 C.F.R. 1506.1 or 10 C.F.R. 1021.211. Moreover, the proposed action would not (i) threaten a violation of applicable statutory, regulatory, or permit requirements for environment, safety, and health, (ii) require siting and construction or major expansion of waste storage, disposal, recovery, or treatment facilities, (iii) disturb hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants, or Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act-excluded petroleum and natural gas products that pre-exist in the environment such that there would be uncontrolled or unpermitted releases, (iv) have the potential to cause significant impacts on environmentally sensitive resources, or (v) involve genetically engineered organisms, synthetic biology, governmentally designated noxious weeds, or invasive species, unless the proposed activity would be contained or confined in a manner designed and operated to prevent unauthorized release into the environment and conducted in accordance with applicable requirements.

Based on the provisions identified on the attachment, this proposed action meets the requirements for the Categorical Exclusion referenced above. We therefore determine that the proposed action may be categorically excluded from further NEPA review and documentation.
