# **KESSELRING SITE GATE 5 PROJECT**

#### REFERENCE

10 CFR Part 1021, Department of Energy National Environmental Policy Act Implementing Procedures, Subpart D, Typical Classes of Actions

### PROJECT SCOPE DISCUSSION

The scope of the Kesselring Site Gate 5 Project includes construction of a new approximately 2,300 square foot Security Area Entry Point (SAEP) Building, a new approximately 80 foot long secure area for truck inspections (truck trap), and a new security police officer booth within the truck trap. The new SAEP and truck trap will be located in vicinity of existing Building 107. The project will include installation of fencing, alarms, lighting, and closed circuit television cameras to support SAEP and truck trap operations.

The project does not violate applicable regulatory requirements, require construction or major extension of waste handling facilities, result in unpermitted releases of hazardous substances, or adversely affect environmentally sensitive resources, including wetlands. The project does not involve genetically engineered organisms or species. There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposed action. The project has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion and is not connected to other actions with potentially significant and/or cumulative impacts.

## CONCLUSION

The Kesselring Site Gate 5 project is categorically excluded from additional NEPA documentation under 10 CFR 1021 Subpart D, Appendix B, B1.15. Specifically, the categorical exclusion that applies is:

#### B1.15 Support buildings

Siting, construction or modification, and operation of support buildings and support structures (including, but not limited to, trailers and prefabricated and modular buildings) within or contiguous to an already developed area (where active utilities and currently used roads are readily accessible). Covered support buildings and structures include, but are not limited to, those for office purposes; parking; cafeteria services; education and training; visitor reception; computer and data processing services; health services or recreation activities; routine maintenance activities; storage of supplies and equipment for administrative services and routine maintenance activities; security (such as security posts); fire protection; small-scale fabrication (such as machine shop activities), assembly, and testing of non-nuclear equipment or components; and similar support purposes, but exclude facilities for nuclear weapons activities and waste storage activities, such as activities covered in B1.10, B1.29, B1.35, B2.6, B6.2, B6.4, B6.5, B6.6, and B6.10 of this appendix.
