<u>Categorical Exclusion Applied (from Subpart D, 10 C.F.R. Part 1021)</u>: B1.25 Real property transfers for cultural resources protection, habitat preservation, and wildlife management

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: BPA is proposing to fund the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes (CSKT) to purchase the Dixon Flathead Property, a 32-acre parcel of land located 34 miles south east of Polson in Sanders County, Montana. BPA would hold a conservation easement to prevent the conversion of fish and wildlife habitat on the property to other land uses.

Funding the purchase of the property would serve as partial mitigation for the construction and operation of the Federal Columbia River Power System which includes dams on the main stem Columbia and Snake Rivers, specifically the Hungry Horse hydroelectric facility on the South Fork of the Flathead River.

The property consists of aquatic, terrestrial, wetland and riparian forest habitat. The Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes would develop a management plan to guide the protection and enhancement of habitat and other resources on the property. The management plan would be reviewed by BPA for consistency with the conservation easement and the purpose of the acquisition. If BPA proposes to fund any additional activities on the property, further environmental review may be conducted.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix A of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist;
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.

Proposed Action: Dixon Flathead Property Acquisition Funding

Project Site Description

The project site comprises approximately 32 acres of terrestrial, wetland, riparian and aquatic habitats along a 0.38 kilometer reach of the lower Flathead River. It is located immediately to the west of the current confluence of the Flathead and Jocko Rivers. The property is bordered to the east by the Pitts mitigation property, a 79.67-acre parcel purchased using BPA funding in 2009 and containing nearly 2.5 km of the Jocko and Flathead Rivers. The site has historically been utilized for agriculture and cattle-grazing. A BPA power transmission line (Hot Springs to Anaconda Transmission Line, builit in 1952) bisects the property from north to south. This is a 230 kilovolt line, and two large metal towers occur on the property as part of the transmission line.
