<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) is proposing to upgrade the current security systems at the Olympia Substation control house to be in compliance with security standards established by the North American Electric Reliability Corporation's Critical Infrastructure Protection (NERC-CIP). Proposed work includes replacement of the front door assembly, new door hardware and modifications to existing card reads to incorporate new door installation. All work would take place within the existing control house and no interior walls would be moved or altered. The project would not involve any ground disturbing activities.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
