Project L-525 will engineer, design, construct and operate a 2.4 mile long 24-inch Export Water line between the 2901-Y Valve House and the 282-E Inlet Valve House in 200E Area. The existing Export Water System provides all the make-up water to the 200 Areas Plateau for the Sanitary Water System, process water, and the Raw Water Grid which provides Fire Protection to all facilities in the 200 Areas. From FY 2006 to FY 2014, there were 5 breaks in the 200W 24-inch EW line. Having served for over 70 years, it has exceeded the design life for which it was originally installed, and will not reliably support the duration of the Hanford Cleanup Mission. When the replacement pipeline is installed and operational, the existing, failing 60.9 centimeter (24-inch) line will be capped and abandoned in place, which will include excavations to access the buried pipeline at each end and potentially at road crossings, non-potable water crossings, drain and vent valve stations.										
Mission Support Alliance (MSA) Environmental Compliance staff performed a pedestrian survey of project area on April 13 and 14 and May 21, 2015. Much of the project site east of Route 4 South is located in previously disturbed areas, including areas of industrial infrastructure, parking lots, roads, storage areas, fences, railroad, and existing export pipelines and utility lines. No plant or animal species protected under the Endangered Species Act, candidates for such protection, or species listed by the Washington State government as threatened or endangered were observed in the vicinity of the proposed project site.										
A Cultural Resources Review(CRR) of the proposed project was conducted by the MSA Cultural and Historic Resources Program. A CRR, with a finding of No Adverse Effect was prepared and submitted to the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) and Area Tribes for a 30 day comment period on September 22, 2015. The SHPO concurred with the findings of the CRR on September 22, 2015. The U.S. Department of Energy Richland Operations Office (DOE/RL) provided a notice of compliance with Section 106 of the National historic Preservation Act										
for this project on November 4, 2015.  It appears to me that this activity is covered under 10 CFR 1021, B5.5, Short pipeline segments. The B5.5 Categorical Exclusion is applicable to pipline segments constructed and operated that are generally less than 20 miles in length and Project L-525 will construct and operate a 2.4 mile long 24-inch Export Water line between the 2901-Y Valve House and the 282-E Inlet Valve House in 200E Area.
