<u>Proposed Action Title</u>: University of California, Los Angeles - CUSB: A Platform Technology for the Renewable Production of Commodity Chemicals

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): Los Angeles, CA

Proposed Action Description:

UCLA proposes to conduct laboratory based, small-scale, research and development activities to demonstrate that bioreactors consisting of celffree biochemical pathways can be built to operate continuously and convert sugars into other useful chemicals. Specifically, UCLA will build a system that can produce gram quantities of terpenoids in high yield via continuous operation of an enzyme bioreactor for several days. Project work involves preparing recombinant plasmids in E. coli for protein expression in E. coli. All project work, including work with genetically engineered organisms or recombinant DNA, will take place in existing research laboratories at UCLA and will comply with applicable local, state, and federal regulations and procedures — including the NIH Guidelines for Research Involving Recombinant DNA Molecules. All hazardous materials, solid wastes, and liquid wastes will be managed and disposed of pursuant to UCLA's established EH&S procedures and in accordance with applicable local, state, and federal regulations and procedures.

Constitution of the contraction

There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposal that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal.

The proposal has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion. This proposal is not connected to other actions with potentially significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.25(a)(1)), is not related to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant impacts (40 CFR 1508.27(b)(7)), and is not precluded by 40 CFR 1506.1 or 10 CFR 1021.211 concerning limitations on actions during preparation of an environmental impact statement.

Based on my review of the proposed action, as NEPA Compliance Officer (as authorized under DOE Order 451.1B), I have determined that the proposed action fits within the specified class(es) of action, the other regulatory requirements set forth above are met, and the proposed action is hereby categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
